## Part Eight - Procedures

## **Section Six – Legal Procedure Rules**

- 1. The Director of Law is authorised to issue, defend, settle or participate in any:
  - (a) legal proceedings; and/or
  - (b) legal procedure,

where such action is necessary to give effect to decisions of the Council or in any case where the Director of Law considers that such action is necessary to protect the Council's interests.

- 2. Where the Council has given requisite authority to some other person to issue, defend, settle or participate in any:
  - (a) legal proceedings; and/or
  - (b) legal procedure,

that person shall exercise that authority subject to the approval of the Director of Law.

## Signature or Authentication of Documents

3. The Director of Law or other person authorised by him or her, will sign any document necessary to any legal procedure or proceedings on behalf of the Council. This will be the case unless legislation otherwise authorises or requires someone else to sign the document or the Council has given the requisite authority to sign the document to some other person.

## **Common Seal of the Council**

4. Some documents have to be sealed rather than signed on behalf of the Council. The Common Seal of the Council (which for the avoidance of doubt can include an electronic seal) will be kept in a safe place by the Director of Law. A decision of the Council, or any part of it, will be sufficient authority for sealing any document necessary to given effect to the decision. The Common Seal will be attached to those documents that in the opinion of the Director of Law should be sealed. The Director of Law or other lawyer, authorised by him or her, will witness the affixing of the sealing.
