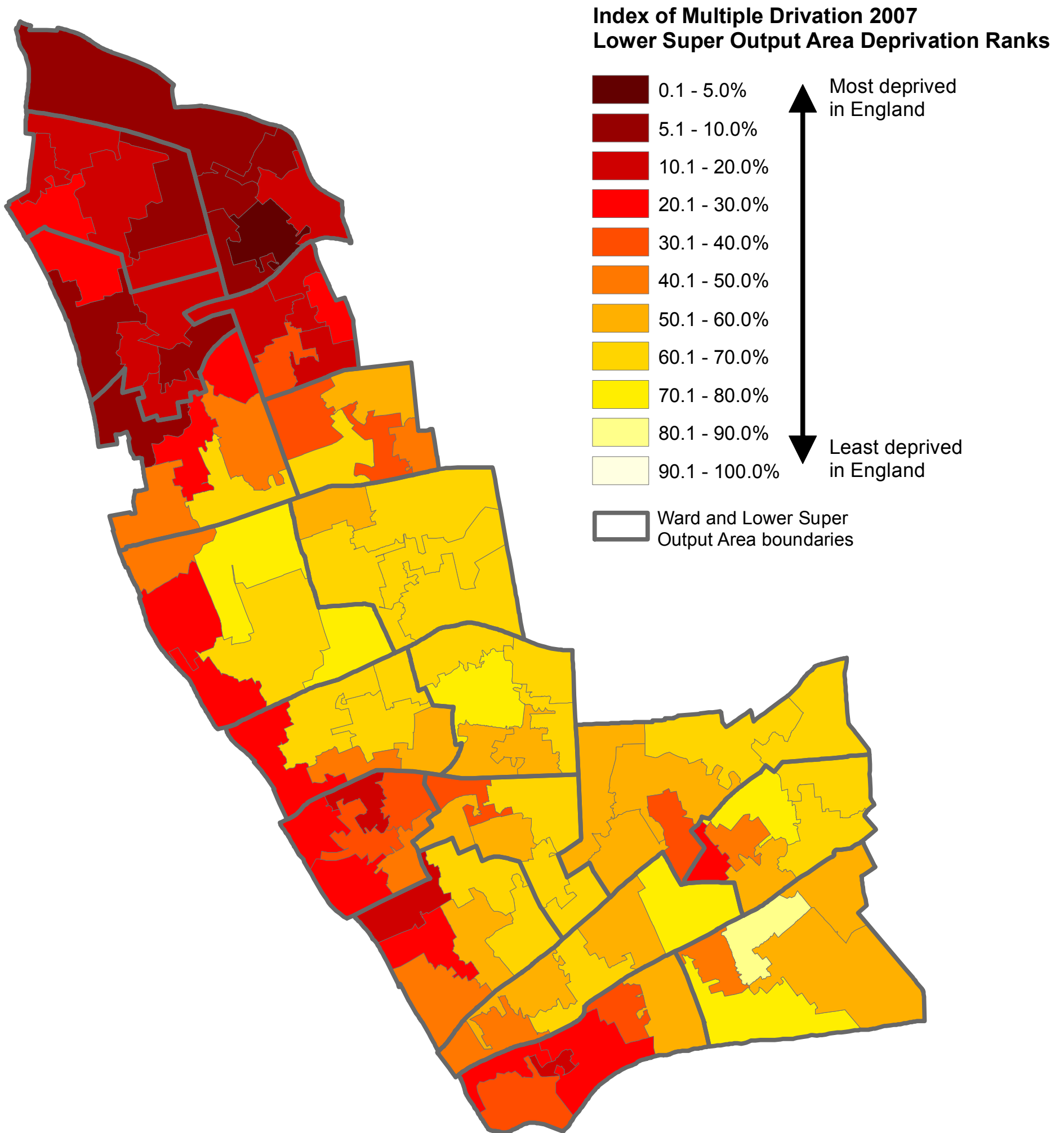


Index of Multiple Deprivation 2007



Understanding the data

The Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD 2007) combines a number of indicators chosen to cover a range of economic, social and physical issues into a single deprivation score for each small area in England. These areas are called Lower Super Output Areas (LSOA's). This allows for each area to be ranked relative to one another according to their level of deprivation.

There are 32,482 LSOA's in England, a ranking of 1 is most deprived and 32,482 least deprived. There are 103 LSOA's in RBKC.

Percentage bands are used in order to compare the extent of deprivation in RBKC LSOA's, to all LSOA's in England. As an example an LSOA in the banding 0.1-5.0% would be said to be within the 5% most deprived in England, 10.1-20.0% within the 20% most deprived etc.
