How do children join the library?

It is easy for children and young people to join the library and there is no minimum age. You don't even have to live in the Royal Borough.

A form needs to be filled in with the child's details and signed by a parent or guardian. You can get a membership form from any of our libraries, or you can download it from our website.



Bring the completed form to any of our libraries along with some proof of identification.

For example:

- The parent or guardian's library membership card
- A utility bill showing the name and address of the person who has signed the form
- A passport
- A bank statement

If you are unsure what documents to bring in with your application, please speak to a member of library staff on **020 7361 3010**.

Internet access

All of our libraries have computers for children's use. The number available will depend on the size of the library. You will be asked to sign a permission form when your child joins the library which allows them to use the computers.

Computers have to be booked and a member of staff will explain how to do this. All of our computers for children are filtered so access to unsuitable websites and chat rooms is restricted.

Chatterbooks

Chatterbooks is a monthly reading group for library members aged eight to 12 years.

They discuss all sorts of books and can choose what they would like to read next. Members often get free books as well.

Sessions last for at least an hour .

Summer Reading Challenge

Every year between July and September we hold a Summer Reading Challenge on a particular theme which is open to library members.

The Summer Reading Challenge is for children aged four to 11 years and they have to read six books to complete the challenge.

There are stickers, bookmarks and other things to collect and a medal and certificate on completion.

Look out for publicity in your local library to find out how to get involved.

Baby Rhyme Time

We hold Baby Rhyme Time sessions in our libraries for children up to two years old.

They are a fun way to enjoy the library with your children.

Children must be library members to take part in Baby Rhyme Time

As these are popular events we have to limit numbers so entry may be refused when the session becomes full. You also may be asked to fold your buggy.

Parents and carers must stay with their children at all times during these sessions.



What can a child borrow?

Borrowing books and talking books are free. There is a charge for borrowing DVDs.

A child can borrow a maximum of 16 items. This can include a combination of the following:

- 12 books
- four talking books
- three DVDs

Books and talking books are issued for three weeks. Other loan periods may vary. Please speak to a member of library staff in your local library or call us on **020 7361 3010** for further information.

Story times

Bookstart

Bookstart is the national programme that encourages parents and carers to enjoy books with babies and young children. Bookstart aims to provide every child aged three and under with three free packs of books. Each pack contains two books.

Bookstart packs are only half of the gift to children and their families. The other, more lasting gift is the message that enjoying books together can develop a lifelong love of books in every child.
