2 In **Golborne ward** Councillors Emma Dent Coad, Bridget Hoier and Pat Mason supported the *Golborne Festival*. This annual event brings people together to celebrate the area's vibrant mix of cultures, much-loved street market, quirky shops and great places to eat and drink. Councillors also funded an outreach project that allowed the ClementJames Centre to provide support and training to help local residents gain new skills and get back into work.

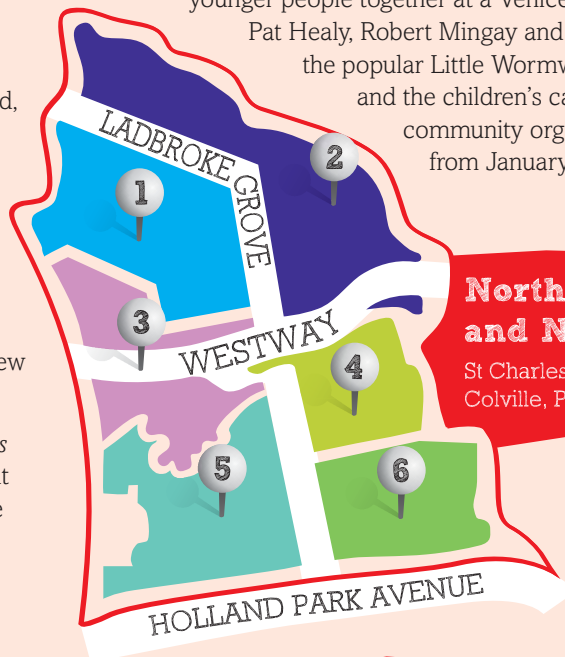
3 In **Notting Barns ward** the successful *St Helen's Festival* that proved so popular in 2011 was brought forward to celebrate the Queen's Diamond Jubilee this summer. Councillors Judith Blakeman, Robert Atkinson and Todd Foreman helped organise and fund the successful street party that brought local people together.

4 Councillors Carol Caruana, Tim Jones and Dez O'Neill in **Colville ward**, are putting culture and the arts at the heart of their plans to improve local life. They have given young people the opportunity to take up dancing classes by supporting local charity *Portobello Dance*. Councillors have also funded *HistoryTalk* to run a project to explore the area's rich history.

5 In **Norland ward**, Councillors Catherine Faulks, David Lindsay and Julie Mills are supporting a community-based website designed to promote what's happening in the area, advertise local employment opportunities and encourage residents to discuss relevant local issues. The project is also designed to give two young people work experience in web development and marketing.

6 **Pembridge ward** residents can share ideas with Councillors David Champion, Doreen Weatherhead and Barbara Campbell in a survey due out autumn/winter 2012. Pembridge also contributed to supplement private fundraising efforts towards an illuminated art sculpture commissioned by the Notting Hill Gate Improvement Group that shows the importance of the area as a main cultural hub as well as capturing the post-Olympic spirit.

1 In **St Charles ward** *Corner 9 Arts* was funded to run a three-part community arts project that brought older and younger people together at a Venice-style masked ball. Councillors Pat Healy, Robert Mingay and Matthew Palmer also supported the popular Little Wormwood Scrubs summer fun day and the children's carnival. A life coaching community organisation is in progress to start from January 2013.
