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1. Executive Summary

The aim of this report is to present the draft two year Health and Wellbeing Implementation Plan (2024-6), which sits below the ten-year Health and Wellbeing Strategy. The Implementation Plan covers all ten of the ambitions of the Health and Wellbeing Strategy, outlining the actions being taken within the first two years to address health inequalities within our communities. The plan will also inform the ongoing work of the Health and Wellbeing Board, with future meetings of the Board looking at the different ambitions in detail, to understand how contributions across the system partners are working to address health inequalities.

The draft document is comprehensive and has had considerable input from a range of stakeholders. All key delivery teams, whether they are located within the local authorities, health, or the VCS have been invited to contribute and shape the content. The HWBB will work with partners to oversee the delivery of the actions.

The HWBB is asked to comment on the draft plan and to agree to have the finalised plan presented to the July HWBB for agreement.

2: Matters for the HWBB

The Health and Wellbeing Implementation Plan is overseen by the joint Health and Wellbeing Board and provides a framework by which it can request lead delivery agencies to present on work being undertaken across the wider determinants of health.

As a partnership document, it has been developed through a collaborative process, with partners coming together to agree actions for the next two years that will have an impact on the strategy. The process has been to work together and develop the plan for each of the ambitions through range of engagement activities, including:

- Representatives from teams and services contributed to the content, highlighting the headline actions they can commit to delivering.
- Multi-agency workshops (x3), facilitated by external consultants early in the new year. These focused on the outcomes the partnership want to achieve, outcomes development and prioritisation methodology as a way to design in the actions required to meet the ambitions of the HWB strategy.
- Ongoing exchanges with representatives by email and, where possible, in person conversations with individual teams, to 'deep-dive' into the delivery areas most relevant to them and finalise proposed actions.

This is a live document that will evolve over time in response to delivery responses and changing needs.

Appendix A provides the draft implementation plan, with suggested highlight key actions for the joint HWBB to focus on over the next 2 years highlighted.
