RENEWING OUR NEIGHBOURHOODS: Action Plan. DRAFT 16.09.02

Part 1: Skills and Knowledge

Neighbourhood Renewal requires a change in the way that public, private and voluntary sector agencies work and engage with communities in deprived areas. Local residents, organisations and public services all have much to contribute to neighbourhood renewal and the fulfilment of its objectives. An integral part of this is the sharing of skills and knowledge so that everyone can contribute fully and to encourage community cohesion.

The table below gives an indication of what has been achieved since October 2001, and what is planned to September 2003; references to Golborne and St Charles (the priority areas) and activities supported by Neighbourhood Renewal programme funding are **highlighted**
