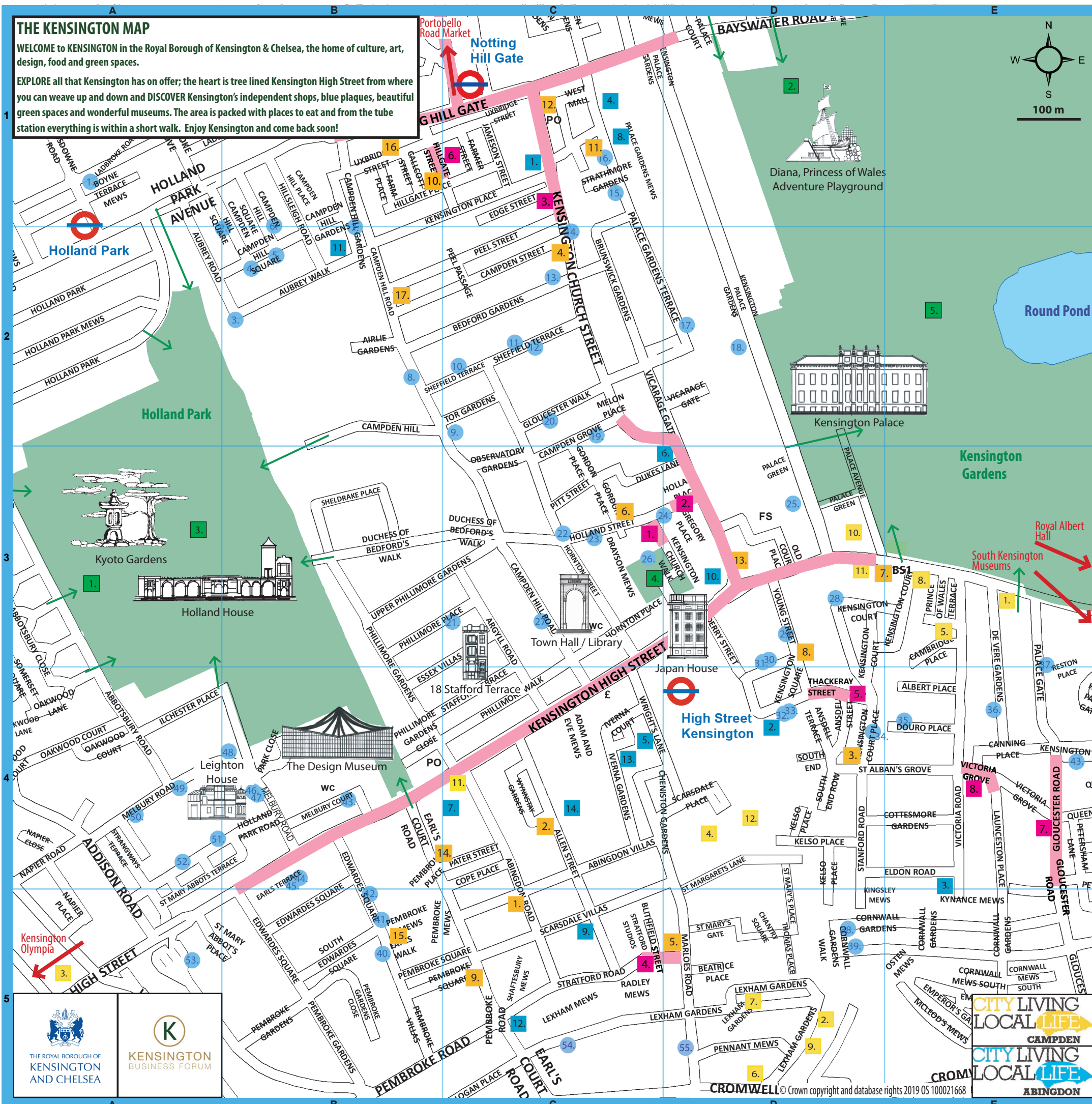


## THE KENSINGTON MAP

**Holland House C3** – built by Sir Walter Cope in 1607, passing through several families until it was bombed in World War II. The remaining part of the house is a fine example of Jacobean architecture.

**Leighton House Museum A4** – Private Palace of Art was the former home and studio of the leading Victorian artist Frederic, Lord Leighton (1830-1896).

**18 Stafford Terrace C3** – is a unique example of a late Victorian townhouse. Home to the Sambourne family it survives with almost all its furniture and fittings intact.

KENSINGTON CHURCH WALK C3

Walkway from Kensington High Street to Holland Street through St Mary Abbott’s with tucked away independent shops including jewellery, vintage, ladies wear with green space

HOLLAND STREET D3

Elephant & Castle Pub, cafes, specialist retailers including jewellery, ladies wear, galleries, gift shop, hair and beauty

KENSINGTON CHURCH STREET C1-D3

Winding from the corner of St Mary Abbots on High Street Kensington to Notting Hill Gate traditionally known for its art and antiques shops, pubs, restaurants, cafes and specialist shops

STRATFORD ROAD C5

Devonshire Arms Pub, neighbourhood restaurants, cafes, small independent shops and essential services

THACKERAY STREET D4

Located off Kensington Square (Kensington’s oldest square founded 1685) it has traditional pubs such as the Builders Arms and the Greyhound as well as an eclectic mix of galleries, restaurants, cafes and independent shops

HILLGATE VILLAGE C1

The Hillgate Pub links to a tucked away side street of cafes and restaurants leading to the Coronet Theatre Print Room

GLOUCESTER ROAD E4

Populated with neighbouring cafes, restaurants, the Gloucester Arms Pub, clothing shops, together with all the essential services including post office, newsagents, stationery, hair and beauty

LAUNCESTON PLACE E4

Galleries, restaurant, café, flowers and other services
