

14. Please can all foot traffic to the development go through Kensington Square, as they are nearer the tube and buses. Please can all the building materials needed for the Kensington Square buildings go through Kensington Square. Please can all vehicles, Lorries, cars, vans, etc, be phoned in when entering our area ( The Victoria road Residence Association Area). We do not want a queue outside the gate in the morning waiting to come in with all the fumes, dust and noise and dirty bottles. There are some very sick people living down this area.
15. South End is a very narrow cobbled road. Any heavy lorries driving down the road, makes the road surface drop. It is also a very narrow road to send such large lorries down. Also wheel chair users find it very difficult to use because of the bumping all the time, and no flat surface.
16. We also would like to make sure that no air conditioning units or kitchen extractor fans will affect other properties around the site now, and in the future. As sick people need to have a constant temperature, these are not shown in the plans and will be needed with the hot weather in the summer, and clean air is needed for those with breathing problems. Can this be a planning condition please.
17. The chapel in Kensington Square, has a quiet prayer room at the back, which is open to the public from 7am in the morning to 7pm at night. Anyone can come and pray there quietly. Sometimes it is very busy, other times no one is there. They do a service there at 5pm each day. Anyone can sit in and listen, or take part. The convent also has a after-school club for children to do their homework in. This takes place in the library room, together with many other charitable things for the community.
18. The Dyslexia Teaching Centre is an educational and charitable foundation, and should be retained on the site if possible, because it serves both private and government schools in the area, and there is nowhere else offering the same service. They also train teachers how to teach and help Dyslexia and Dyscalculia's children. Heythrop site has always been a charitable and educational foundation. Can this be part of the new site?
19. The dust and noise down South End Row is likely to be almost unbearable, though the nuisance may be alleviated if the road is swept clean every day during the development. Also the lorries washes before coming out of the site. This should be a condition when planning permission is granted. Also the roads will need to be repaired and reinstated.
20. The combination of the traffic for St Thomas' School and Victoria road Montessori school (at Christ Church Eldon road), the school-children walking around the area, Richmond collage students, and the construction traffic for the site, needs to be addressed carefully. St Thomas' has the use of 24 St Albans Grove, where the children have their meals and to do theatre study and music. St Thomas' children range from age 4 to age 12, and cross St Albans Grove throughout the day. They also cross Victoria road as well.
21. The embassies have certain needs, with protesters, and heightened security with more traffic around and people. This has not been addressed in the proposal.
