There is no need whatsoever for this development. The area is already well served with very expensive, empty, UNSOLD flats. One

Kensington Gardens would be a very good example,

By granting this permission the council will be backtracking on its policy of protection for social and community uses by demolishing

Heythrop College and therefore the use of its amenities.

There will be danger and damage to the local community. There is Thomas's school with two venues, one for 4-7 year olds (corner of Victoria Road and St Albans Grove) the other 7-11 corner of Cottesmore Gardens and Stanford Road whose access for both children and parents (parking) will be massively affected. There is potential for a serious accident blackspot here, Even worse at 21 St Albans Grove the school have their canteen whose steps to the front door cannot be more than 15 feet from an already narrow street which is proposed to be the main thoroughfare for traffic headed to the college. Insanity.
