Last year, we asked North Kensington community organisers to submit ideas for projects that would help support the community-led recovery.

As part of the Grenfell Recovery Strategy, North Kensington residents can now vote for those shortlisted community projects that matter most to you.

This latest Grenfell Projects Fund which has £600K to allocate to successful projects, has been designed with the North Kensington Residents' Panel. It focuses on bringing the North Kensington community together, community based, cultural enrichment and caring for our most vulnerable.

This booklet gives you information about each of the shortlisted projects and how much money they have applied for. It also outlines how and where you can vote.

African Women's Care: Rebuilding Lives

Amount applied for:

£48,600

Help us transform lives in North Kensington by supporting women from BAME communities deeply affected by mental health challenges and the Grenfell fire.

With your vote, we can provide culturally sensitive counselling, trauma-informed care, and practical assistance like food parcels and childcare to alleviate daily struggles.

Our initiative goes beyond support by creating opportunities for healing and connection. Weekly yoga in the park, walking groups, and dance sessions will nurture physical and emotional wellbeing while strengthening community bonds. Creative workshops, from bead-making to card design, will empower women to express themselves and regain confidence.

By funding interpreters and training volunteers in trauma care, we'll break down barriers, ensuring no one is left behind. Your vote can make a lasting difference-helping women heal, grow, and rebuild their lives in a supportive, inclusive community. Together, we can empower resilience and hope.

Community Cook Off: Community Cook Off Kitchen

Amount applied for:

£40,000

The Community Cook-Off Kitchen is a vital initiative that brings people together through the shared experience of cooking.

We focus on equipping young people with essential life skills, such as healthy meal planning, batch cooking, and budgeting, empowering them for a brighter future.

Beyond that, our kitchen serves as a welcoming space for the entire community to connect, share, and learn.

Our mission extends to combating isolation and loneliness by creating a supportive environment where everyone, regardless of background, feels included. We will use this funding to source fresh ingredients, buy equipment, use local suppliers and facilitate community cooking sessions, including school holiday programs for children and families.

We will also highlight the rich tapestry of local cuisines by providing home cooks with a platform to showcase their recipes, celebrating cultural diversity and inspiring others. Funding will help us create a sense of belonging, promote healthier lifestyles, and build stronger community connections, one meal at a time.

Community Development 4 All CIC: H.E.A.R.T

(Healing, Empowerment, Arts, Relaxation, Togetherness)

Amount applied for:

£25,000

H.E.A.R.T (Healing, Empowerment, Arts, Relaxation, Togetherness) is a community-driven project supporting the elderly in North Kensington.

Drawing on my lived experience of vulnerability and caregiving, this initiative provides essential personal care services such as haircuts, massages, and manicures, restoring dignity and confidence; while nourishing meals address food insecurity. In addition, we will provide social activities such as chess, dancing, and bingo.

Group exercises and social activities foster intergenerational communication, reduce isolation, and build lasting community relationships.

Funding will be used to hire professionals, personal care specialists, and local chefs, as well as to cover costs for fresh ingredients, venue rental, transportation, and outreach efforts.

Also, health and wellness services already provided by the NHS including screenings, will be offered, including, nutrition education, and trauma-informed mental health support.

By collaborating with local organisations, H.E.A.R.T maximises impact, avoids duplicating services, and creates a safe, inclusive space where dignity, well-being, and resilience are nurtured across generations.

Organisation

Grenfell Speaks: PodSpeaks

Amount applied for:

£5,000

Our project aims to unite and empower the community through targeted workshops, mentoring opportunities, and a culminating community event. These activities are designed to nurture growth, creativity, and meaningful connections, helping participants develop much-needed 21st-century skills and strengthen bonds within the local area.

Workshops: Focused on practical topics in technology and entrepreneurship, these sessions will be accessible to individuals at various skill levels. Led by knowledgeable facilitators, they will offer hands-on learning and an inclusive space for collaboration and skill development.

Mentoring: Participants will benefit from one-to-one guidance provided by experienced mentors. This tailored support will boost confidence, provide valuable insights, and help participants tackle challenges effectively.

Community Event: The programme will conclude with an event showcasing participants' progress. This gathering will celebrate achievements, connect individuals with local stakeholders, and encourage further collaboration and skill development.

Hot Stuff Studio Collective - Portobello Heritage School of Ceramics, Art and Design CIC: eCeramic Art for All - Notting Dale Heritage Craft

Amount applied for:

£55,000

Hot Stuff Studio unite our neighbourhood through creative wellbeing and manual skills, offering an antidote to digital saturation.

Our Community Kiln provides a safe, beautiful space for ceramic art, building on North Kensington's rich pottery heritage dating to pre-Victorian times. Our two-year 'Ceramic Art for All!' programme delivers three key initiatives: Firstly, weekly after-school clubs and Half Term Family Ceramic Camps make pottery accessible and engaging for families. Second of all, dedicated morning sessions at Bay20 serve vulnerable groups, including mental health patients and those in recovery. And third, weekly classes at Pepper Pots cater specifically to elderly residents, ensuring safe, supported access.

As representatives of vulnerable groups ourselves, we understand the importance of accessibility and inclusive community spaces. Our programme combines cultural enrichment with practical skills, fostering creativity and connection across generations while preserving local craft traditions.

Kensington Dragons Football Club: **Football for All**

Amount applied for:

£60,000

Kensington Dragons runs free football coaching and educational programmes for young people in west London.

The inequalities in North Kensington and the surrounding areas combined with the pandemic, Cost of Living Crisis and the Grenfell disaster have increased the stark differences in young people's outcomes. We charge zero fees and the club is financed by voluntary donations and grants. Our volunteers provide local young people from all backgrounds with the skills and training to improve their opportunities and wellbeing. By bringing different local communities together, we are united in a common purpose: to improve lives and create social capital. Players, parents, supporters and helpers from all backgrounds work together to build bridges, friendships and people. We work with over 400 young people at least twice a week in the fresh air, using football to help them reach their potential regardless of their socio-economic background.

Kensington Football Academy: Train to Gain

Amount applied for:

£5,000

At last year's Grenfell memorial cup at St. George's Stadium, we were inspired by the raw footballing talent of Kensington and Chelsea. With the invaluable support of influential figures like Andy Evans, Les Ferdinand of QPR, Brentford Football Club, and a Northampton Football Scout, we are planning to create a community based football academy.

We will offer weekly 1.5 hour footballing training sessions to boys aged 11-25 for 50 weeks that will take place at St Charles Sports Hall. Funding will pay for pitch hire, on the weekends as we will be in a league and competing against other teams, sessional coaching staff and a contribution towards referees and equipment. The Academy will offer comprehensive support, mentoring, and resources to nurture young football talent. Through structured training, educational support, and life skills development, we aim to transform dreams into realistic outcomes. Qualified semi-pro coaches are ready to take sessions to the next level with further funding. Providing instruction and guidance, the coaches are knowledgeable in the fundamentals of the game, as well as tactical and technical aspects. They will implement a variety of drills and exercises designed to ensure players are physically and mentally prepared for competition, with improvements to technical, tactical, physical, strength and conditioning and mental aspects of the game. There will also be a focus on nutrition, injury prevention and developing players' leadership and teambuilding skills.

Kids On The Green CIC: North Kensington Voices

Amount applied for:

£25,000

Our project will provide a dedicated professional and industry-standard media platform (KOTGTV) for individuals and community groups across North Kensington to come together to discuss and celebrate themes that are important to them.

There will be a strong focus on shared experiences of the journey to recovery NK residents have collectively been travelling. KOTG TV a new resource that will invite residents and local orgs/groups to participate in and lead regular visual.

The funding will be used to develop and deliver the professional podcast resource which up until now has been created and sustained by voluntary hours worked by staff and equipment donated. Essential media equipment will be purchased and young people from NK who KOTG have trained to work camera, light and sound will be paid to create and facilitate podcasts. The project will be heavily advertised and promoted within North Kensington. The funding will cover 3 x weekly podcast.

Lancaster West Children's Community Network: Fathers Group

Amount applied for:

£25,700

Stay-and-play sessions in North Ken designed specifically for young fathers aged 18 to 24 and their children, aged 6 and under to drop in and play.

Held every Saturday from 10am to 1pm, these two-hour sessions will offer a variety of activities aimed at enhancing the father-child bond and fostering positive, meaningful interactions.

Activities will include arts, cooking, sports, music, and gardening, providing opportunities for creativity, learning, and physical engagement.

The programme's core objective is to create a supportive and empowering space where fathers can develop confidence and essential parenting skills. It will also offer a unique chance for fathers to connect with peers, share experiences, and gain valuable insights on supporting their children's emotional, social, and developmental needs. Through these sessions, we aim to build a strong community of fathers, equipped with the tools to nurture their children and strengthen family relationships.

Latimer Community Art Therapy: HD Kids Club

Amount applied for:

£23,304

Funding for children & young people at the Henry Dickens Community Centre.

Term-time after school kids clubs, accessible art therapy groups, and individual art psychotherapy support for children and families who need it - our work helps improve and maintain health, build and develop friendships and relationships, and supports our young people to feel good about themselves and what they can achieve. The HD is a treasured community space and your vote will help it to stay that way.

Latymer Community Church: Uniting and Caring for Our Community

Amount applied for:

£6,580

We believe in the power within our community to bring about healing.

Our project has two strands; bringing our community together and celebrating our strengths through a Community Friendship Meal and a Community Heroes Awards Ceremony, and caring for our most vulnerable by running a Bereavement Journey course and by giving holistic, long-term relational support to those in need.

The Friendship Meal brings people together from across cultures and generations to enjoy delicious food, which strengthens existing relationships and grows new ones. The Community Heroes Awards Ceremony celebrates the incredible unsung heroes of our neighbourhood, such as awesome overcomers, committed carers and fantastic friends.

The Bereavement Journey is a tried-and-tested nationally-recognised course for anyone bereaved at any time, and past participants with us have found it really helpful. Our individual support walking alongside the most vulnerable is built on long-term loving relationships which have deep and enduring impact.

Organisation

Layla Salha Project: Stretch and Mobility

Amount applied for:

£5,000

I am a qualified personal trainer; I have worked in the fitness industry for the last 24 years. I am also a qualified shiatsu practitioner and a body Psychotherapist.

I would like to bring about a holistic healing approach to many physical issues residents of the North Kensington community have been facing.

My aim is to deliver 2 weekly sessions for 28 weeks of practical stretching and mobility group classes that target the areas of concerns for each person along with consultations for those who have long term unresolved physical issues.

I will also incorporate an introduction to pressure points release to help alleviate pain in the body.

I would like to work on offering support to heal and prevent injuries, on improving joints flexibility and to also provide a safe space to connect with our bodies.

Mo1 Youths: Healing Through Connection: Youth and Family Resilience in North Kensington

Amount applied for:

£59,848

Our project supports young people and families affected by the Grenfell tragedy, promoting healing, well-being, and stronger community connections. Through mentoring, therapeutic boxing, and creative photography, we aim to build resilience and emotional balance.

An experienced mentor will guide 25 young people annually, helping them overcome challenges. Photography workshops provide a creative outlet for self-expression, while boxing sessions develop discipline and confidence. Our Parent Carer Champions programme will support 60 families each year with workshops on stress management, family health, and advocacy. Parent carers will also take a lead role in organising community events, bringing people together for shared recovery.

This initiative strengthens family resilience, enhances emotional well-being, and builds a more connected community. By working with schools, health services, and local organisations, we aim to create long-term social value and a brighter future for North Kensington.

Organisation

Neighbourhood Doulas: Neighbourhood Doulas Services

Amount applied for:

£60,000

Neighbourhood Doulas is a grassroots maternal health charity based in Ladbroke Grove.

We provide free, culturally sensitive, and trauma-informed doula care to vulnerable pregnant women and birthing people, including asylum seekers, survivors of violence, and those experiencing homelessness or poor mental ill health. Our work addresses critical health inequalities and builds confidence for pregnant women in preparation for childbirth and beyond.

We require funding to provide 50 pregnant women with holistic antenatal, birth, and postnatal support. This includes birth education and preparation, advocacy, 24/7 birth support, practical assistance, and connections to local resources. By building trust and addressing barriers, we aim to improve maternal and infant health outcomes while reducing social isolation and empowering women to engage confidently with healthcare professionals.

Our trauma-informed approach, co-designed with service users, strengthens local community partnerships and promotes longevity. Funding will enable us to expand our work and create lasting change.

Octavia Foundation: Base Productions

Amount applied for:

£60,000

Over the next two years, you can help us preserve our rich, proud history in North Kensington, by working with 250 young people (aged 14-27) to make their filmmaking/creative dreams come true.

Base Productions pays young people for their work on commissions with real partners, helping them grow their skills and confidence to produce thoughtful films with tremendous social impact. We also run weekly sessions to work on filmmaking projects, and go into the spaces of hardest to reach young people at risk of being excluded from school, to ignite their creativity and show them we value their voice. Our team are successful creatives, experts in creating a family like atmosphere where everyone is respected and their voices championed. It is one of the reasons our young people are able to create such inspiring films.

Organisation

Portobello Dance and Performing Arts School (Mark Elie Dance Foundation): Just Dance - Empowering the Next Generation

Amount applied for:

£60,000

The project will provide children from deprived backgrounds with the opportunity to learn various dance genres in a safe, supportive environment. Aimed at those still impacted by the Grenfell tragedy, it offers therapeutic activities to help children cope with their trauma and engage in positive creative expression.

The funding will support 30 vulnerable children, teaching them ballet, tap, contemporary dance, and musical theatre. For those with prior dance experience, the program will offer opportunities for progression. Students will gain the confidence and skills needed to perform publicly, preparing for exams, auditions, and potential dance college applications. Participants will receive up to 4 hours of lessons per week, perform in two annual shows, and attend a two-week summer school with workshops from West End stars and choreographers. The children will also take part in musical theatre workshops, with performances at the Tabernacle and local schools, where parents and the community can attend.

Portobello Radio CIC: Portobello Community Radio Roadshow

Amount applied for:

£12,480

Portobello Radio would use the funding to create a series of 12 radio shows/podcasts that provide cultural enrichment and practical advice.

The starting point is a live discussion in front of a local audience that beings together residents with local organisations and experts to discuss issues that impact our local lives, such as health, environment, cost of living and culture.

Renegade Theatre Community Interest Company: Express Yourself

Amount applied for:

£45,920

Express Yourself is a continuation of our successful, free theatre and performance project, offering a creative outlet for North Kensington residents aged from 16-70+.

Over the next two years, local professional creatives will guide participants in acting, theatre, and filmmaking. Through fun games, improvisations, movement, and voice work, the participants will explore themes that reflect and resonate deeply with their lives, turning strong emotions into artistry.

Experienced practitioners Natasha Langridge and Tamara Camacho will lead weekly workshops at the Venture Centre, with public performances and films showcased at Morley College's Theatre and The Portobello Film Festival. Funding will cover costs of facilitators/guest artists, Venue, workshop materials, publicity and production.

By providing a safe space for creative expression and enabling connections across generations, Express Yourself will play a vital role in North Kensington's ongoing recovery and cultural enrichment, transforming inexperienced community members into confident performers and storytellers.

Organisation

Swimunity CIC: Making the joy of swimming accessible to all

Amount applied for:

£59,814

Securing funding from the GPF would allow us to continue our successful Saturday programme in the local community, providing free weekly swimming lessons for up to 80 young people each term; promoting water safety and teaching an essential life-skill.

These lessons are targeted towards young people who may not otherwise have the opportunity to learn to swim, removing the cost barrier and therefore working to tackle the low attainment levels in swimming that are often seen in areas of high deprivation. These lessons not only help young people build essential life skills and promote health and well-being, but also help to foster a more active community that feel welcome, safe and at ease with the water.

The Nucleo Project: Community Music Programme

Amount applied for:

£60,000

Nucleo changes young lives through music. Our community music programme gives local children and young people aged 0 to 20 the opportunity to learn an instrument and be part of a musical ensemble, taking part in classes and practice sessions 3+ times a week, completely for free.

Studying music is a powerful, proven way for young people to discover and fulfil their individual potential and build confidence whilst developing strong connections and friendships. By making music together at Nucleo, young people cooperate to achieve shared goals and build bonds of trust within a supportive learning environment. Our free programme is accessible whatever a young person's background. It makes music education an inclusive and unifying experience open to the whole community.

Support from the Grenfell Projects Fund would fully fund the participation of 35 young people aged 11 to 20 in Nucleo's Community Programme for the next two years.

Organisation

The Playground Theatre: WeStart

Amount applied for:

£40,000

WeStart enables local residents to tell their story their way via the arts. Resident-led and providing arts activities in anything from sculpture to spoken word, we offer training sessions for employment and Community Workshops with top artistic talent.

We'll expand our successful Family Story Time groups in W11, which include storytelling, arts, crafts and play, while giving away cost of living items like nappies, books and toys. Via top partners we'll provide Free tickets to the National Theatre, Royal Court and Saatchi Gallery, as well as bringing those institutions to W11. We will expand our award winning LGBTQ Arts Groups for elders and young people, and our weekly Online Creative Writing sessions with two professional writers supporting any resident in any creative writing project. With support from GPF4 we will fulfil residents' requests to support a choir and work with forgotten communities.

The SPACE: The North Kensington One Connection

Amount applied for:

£59,170

As a local community-led charity, the SPACE is building a stronger, more connected North Kensington, and we need your support!

Our project will bring vibrant community festivals, annual art exhibitions, and monthly cultural workshops, all co-designed with local residents to celebrate our rich heritage. We'll amplify community voices through a resident-led podcast series, sharing stories that matter and our journey through Grenfell recovery. Plus, we'll provide direct support with housing, health, education, employment, and benefits, ensuring no one is left behind. But that's not all—we'll train local residents as navigators, equipping them with skills to support their neighbours in their estate or ward. Through volunteering and skills training, we'll empower people to make lasting change fostering a culture of care and mutual assistance.

The Westside Community Foundation: One London Basketball

Amount applied for:

£30,000

Our project unites young people aged 11-18 in North Kensington through basketball and netball, fostering inclusivity, friendships, and a sense of belonging.

Open to all skill levels, our sessions promote physical, emotional, and social growth while encouraging a healthy, active lifestyle. They provide a structured, safe space for stress relief, skill-building, and teamwork, offering consistency and routine. Beyond the sessions, we host regular community games, involving families, friends, and residents, to celebrate young athletes and strengthen community bonds. By creating an engaging, supportive environment, we aim to reignite pride, rebuild connections, and foster a shared identity.

Wst Ldn Shields: Wst Ldn Shields Football

Amount applied for:

£5,000

Wst Ldn Shields is a volunteer led club and was started at a time when women's football was at its peak, yet it was still lacking in West London.

Football and exercise should be accessible for women of all ages, providing a place to enjoy the game they love, with no pressure or judgement. We are seeking funding to cover essential costs such as pitch hire, coaching, game and training kits, first aid supplies, football equipment, replacing a camera phone for capturing and sharing our journey, tournament/league fees, insurance, and refreshments. This support will allow us to continue providing sessions in a safe and fun environment that encourages mental health and physical fitness. Our goal is to build a stronger, fitter, and more confident community of women through football.

How we got here - the process

Once all applications for the Grenfell Projects Fund 24/25 were received, Council officers checked that they met the minimum criteria so could be sent to the North Kensington Residents' Panel for review.

These initial checks involved ensuring that all applying organisations were constituted and all application forms had been completed correctly and provided the right level of information.

The North Kensington Residents' Panel then carried out an initial assessing and shortlisting of eligible projects so they could go through to the public vote. They scored the applications against impact and priorities; delivery and experience; monitoring and evaluation; financials, value for money, and sustainability. This step ensured that the community was involved in making sure applications were assessed correctly and that projects met the Grenfell community's needs.

The total number of applications received for the Grenfell Projects Fund 2024/25 was 83 and the total requested funds was £2,885,385.28.

Fifty-five applications passed the initial checks by officers and went to the North Kensington Residents' Panel to be assessed and scored. The total requested funds from eligible and compliant applications was £1,814,399.

Each application received scores from two residents' panel members and one Council project officer. Average scores rank applications, followed by a deliberation session to finalise the public vote shortlist.

Applications that have successfully made it through to the public vote and receive the most votes will receive the full funding they apply for rather than partial funding as has been the case in previous years.

The results of the public vote will be announced in April 2025. We will be contacting all shortlisted applicants to let them know the outcome of the public vote and will update all Council channels with the results.
