

Local Plan Partial Review Local Development Scheme

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1. INTRODUCTION AND CONTEXT

1.1 WHAT IS THE LOCAL DEVELOPMENT SCHEME?

1.1.1 The Local Development Scheme (LDS) is effectively a document which sets out the timetable for the preparation and review of the Council's planning policy documents. The LDS is required to be published by law.

1.2 WHAT IS THE RELEVANT LEGISLATION AND GUIDANCE?

- 1.2.1 The primary legislation relating to LDSs is the **Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004**₁ (as amended) ('the Act').
- 1.2.2 The secondary legislation relating to LDSs is **The Town and Country Planning** (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012₂ (as amended) ('the Regulations').
- 1.2.3 The national government guidance relating to LDSs is in the **National Planning Practice Guidance on Local Plans** ('the NPPG')₃.
- 1.2.4 The Council must prepare and maintain a LDS as required by Section 15(1) of the Act and paragraph 009 of the NPPG.
- 1.2.5 Having an up-to-date LDS is important to ensure that "local communities and interested parties can keep track of progress" of Local Plans4.

1.3 WHAT MUST THE LDS INCLUDE?

- 1.3.1 The LDS must specify₅:
 - Local development documents which are to be 'development plan documents' (i.e. Local Plan policies);
 - The subject matter and geographical area to which each document is to relate;
 - Which (if any) are to be prepared jointly with one or more other local planning authorities;
 - Any matter or area in respect of which the authority has agreed (or proposes to agree) to the constitution of a joint committee;

- The timetable for the preparation and revision of the documents; and
- Such other matters as are prescribed.

1.4 WHEN DOES THE LDS TAKE EFFECT?

- 1.4.1 To bring the LDS into effect, the Council must resolve that the scheme is to have effect and in the resolution specify the date from which the scheme is to have effect₆.
- 1.4.2 This LDS takes effect from **2 May 2017** and supersedes previous LDSs from May 2016, April 2014, November 2012 and March 2010.

1.5 WHEN CAN THE LDS BE REVISED?

1.5.1 The Council may revise its LDS "at such time as they consider appropriate"7.

1.6 HOW IS THE LDS MADE PUBLIC?

- 1.6.1 The Council must make the following available to the publics:
 - The up-to-date text of the LDS provided as section 2 to this document;
 - A copy of any amendments made to the LDS provided as section 3 to this document; and
 - Up-to-date information showing the state of the Council's compliance (or non-compliance) with the timetable.
- 1.6.2 The Council is required to publish the LDS on its web site and keep it up to date9.
- 1.6.3 The LDS is available on the Council's planning policy web pages₁₀.

1.7 HOW DOES THE LDS RELATE TO THE LOCAL PLAN?

1.7.1 The preparation or revision of a Local Plan document must be "in accordance with" the LDS₁₁.

1.8 HOW DOES THE LDS RELATE TO NEIGHBOURHOOD PLANS?

1.8.1 There is no requirement to list Neighbourhood Plans in the LDS. The latest information on Neighbourhood Planning in the Borough is available on the

1.9 HOW DOES THE LDS RELATE TO THE MONITORING REPORT?

- 1.9.1 The Council publishes a 'Monitoring Report' on an annual basis to report on the implementation of its planning policies and other matters.
- 1.9.2 The Monitoring Reports for each year are available on the Council's planning policy web pages₁₃.
- 1.9.3 The Council's Monitoring Report must contain the following information relating to the LDS:
 - The title of the Local Plans or Supplementary Planning Documents (SPDs) specified in the Council's LDS;
 - In relation to each of those documents:
 - The timetable specified in the Council's LDS for the document's preparation;
 - The stage the document has reached in its preparation; and
 - If the document's preparation is behind the LDS timetable, the reasons for this; and
 - Where any Local Plan or SPD specified in the Council's LDS has been adopted or approved within the Monitoring Report's monitoring period, a statement of that fact and the date of adoption or approval.
- 1.9.4 The NPPG is clear that "Up-to-date and accessible reporting on the LDS in an Authority's Monitoring Report is an important way in which Local Planning Authorities can keep communities informed of plan making activity"14.

1.10 WHO MUST BE CONSULTED ON THE LDS?

1.10.1 There is no requirement to consult on an LDS or to submit to the Mayor of London or Secretary of State.
