

## KEY

1. Corolle Planters: Planters with domed mesh canopy to allow for climbing plants. Structures reference the shape of hot air balloons, whilst aiding urban cooling, filtering air pollutants and attracting pollinators.
2. Raised planters with tree planting, creating shelter and shade.
3. Linear orchard: Raised planters with espalier fruit tree planting.
4. Raised planter with trellis and climbing plants, screening the walls and elements along boundaries.
5. Linear raised planters with trellis and climbing plants, incorporating large letter habitat panels spelling 'Cremorne Wharf' creating a focal point at the centre of the park.
6. Series of play mounds with low level play equipment, to include accessible and inclusive activities.
7. Curved timber seating for panoramic views across the Thames, including: benches, loungers and podiums with and without arm and back rests to maximise accessibility.
8. Benches with and without arm and back rests to maximise accessibility.
9. Raised planters with tree planting and seating in quieter part of the park.
10. Trompe l'oeil ('deceive the eye') mural de-marking Thames Tideway Tunnel in playful waterfall artwork.
11. Table tennis tables.
12. Chess Tables.
13. Football and basketball courts.
14. Petanque court.
15. Running track.
16. Food & Beverage outlet: Space for coffee truck, seating, drinking fountain and toilets.
17. Park information board, including history of the Site.

\* All elements are designed to be demountable and moveable, allowing adaptability if the wider community of Cremorne changes it's needs in the future.

\* Play equipment, activities and sport in 'Activities Zone' are all flexible and would be developed through consultation with the local community.


