1. Previous meeting notes

Works update

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- NT shared an overview of the programme.
- NT provided an update on the works and respective status below.

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Block B

- The CConservation Oefficer will be on_site onTues 30th27 November 2018 and 7th December 2018—to make decisions on the concrete base/trim finish for Internal CCrittall windows.
- Communal crittall window replacements are 75% complete.
- Works to the balcony in Flat 3 <u>areis</u> underway.
- Internal works has started; we have accessed approximately 70 properties have been accessed so far.
- We currently have not been able to source iThe ironmongery for windows and sliding doors have still not been sourced. Currently the project team is exploring. We are still looking at potentially getting them bespoke route.made.

Block A

- Scaffold strike currently on floor level 15.
- Concrete repairs 100% complete only scaffold tie inserts are left to repair.
- Window overhauls and timber care repairs 90% complete.
- Private balcony timber cladding and external decorations 85% complete.
- Internal works 20% complete.
- Viewing tower/old boiler room decorations is now complete.
- Scaffold on viewing tower is being taken down sequentially with the <u>Cerittall</u> windows' installations.
- JP queried the pigeon netting installation process, will the netting follow across each balcony floor/level.
- IR noted confirmed the pigeon netting installation details, is as described and will show drawings to JP by email or phone. (A)

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3. Security
