



EMPLOYABILITY PROGRAMME

Here are some of the Employability programmes that QPR in the Community Trust deliver, aiming to engage, provide and support young people with numerous opportunities to gain employment, education and training.



Premier League Inspires Traineeships

Premier League Inspires uses the appeal of the Premier League and professional football clubs to support 11-25 year olds who are marginalised or at risk of not reaching their potential as they move through the education system and early adulthood, allowing them to develop personal skills, knowledge and behaviours that will benefit them throughout their lives. The Premier League Inspires Traineeships are a 12-week work-based learning programme for 16-24-year olds, focusing on employability skills and personal development, delivered in partnership with Warwickshire College Group, EFL Trust and The Premier League Charitable Fund. This programme provides young people with support to develop their personal and social skills, giving them the confidence and the experience required to make a positive transition

into education, access training or gain meaningful employment. The Community Trust provides intensive one-to-one and group work focusing on each individual's needs. Young people on the programme are given the opportunity to undertake various qualifications, Maths and English, work placements, training programmes and workshops that will enhance personal/ social skills and experience. Progressions include apprenticeships, university degrees, paid work and networking with other community sports organisations to find a career path.

QPR Works

A life-skills programme for designed to develop self-esteem and confidence for young people aged 16-24 with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities. Participants are supported to improve enterprise and life skills through various qualifications, training programmes and workshops. Ultimately assisting individuals to make a positive transition into education, employment and training opportunities.



Work Experience

We offer work experience placements here at QPR Community Trust, whereby individuals complete various tasks, a work experience journal and shadow staff in a range of departments to gain an insight and learn more about what it is like to work for a community development organisation and professional football club.

Volunteering

We offer a volunteer programme for individuals to develop their own skills and confidence whilst giving back to their local community. All volunteers are offered a Level 1 Award in Volunteering, First Aid and Safeguarding training, as well as undergoing an enhanced DBS check. We support volunteers to access further training, qualifications and offer them a range of positive experience to support their long-term development.

The QPR Learner Centre

This is a purpose-built classroom at Loftus Road Stadium which has helped us engage with over 5,000 local young people and adults through education and employability programmes, to enhance life chances and career opportunities of participants.
