

Comments

• In 2001, half of all Kensington and Chelsea residents classified themselves as 'White British'. A further 29% considered themselves to be of 'Other White' ethnicity; the largest proportion of anywhere in England.

• Kensington and Chelsea has fewer residents from the Black and Asian groups compared to London.

• In the north of the borough, the proportion from Black and Minority ethnic groups is twice that found in the rest of the borough.

The 'Other' category includes: 'Mixed' ethnicity, 'Chinese' and 'Other Ethnic' group e.g. Middle Eastern and Far East Asian populations

North K&C: St Charles, Golborne, Notting Barns, Colville, Norland and Pembridge wards

Central K&C: Holland, Campden, Abingdon, Queen's Gate, Earl's Court and Courtfield wards

South K&C: Redcliffe, Stanley, Cremorne, Royal Hospital, Hans Town and Brompton wards

• This category captures some of the diversity of the borough's population, and includes some residents from Middle Eastern/ Arabic and Far Eastern communities.





Comments


- Kensington and Chelsea has the tenth lowest proportion of residents classified as "White British" of any borough in the country, with most wards much lower than the London average.
- Queens Gate (SW7) and Golborne (W10) have particularly low levels of "White British".
- Wards in the south of the borough have the highest number of residents that are classed as "White British"; the percentages are similar to the London average.



Comments

- Kensington & Chelsea has the highest proportion of "White Other" population of any borough in the country, with more than a quarter of all residents falling into this category.
- The proportion of the population classifying themselves as "White Other" is high across all parts of the borough.
- Groups in Kensington & Chelsea identifying themselves as "White Other" include Americans, Europeans and residents of Middle Eastern origin.





Comments

- Kensington and Chelsea has a smaller proportion of residents from the Black ethnic group compared to London, but three times the national rate.
- Residents are predominantly living in wards with high levels of social housing and deprivation. In Golborne, this group form a quarter of the population.
- Three quarters of the Black population in Kensington and Chelsea live in social housing.



• The proportion of Asians within Kensington and Chelsea is similar to the national picture but the overall percentage is small compared to London.








Comments
