This Guide sets out to help you in your search for training and work in Kensington and Chelsea. It concentrates on listing local organisations but there are, of course, lots of other places in London where you can get help. Many of the local organisations listed here will be able to refer you to organisations based outside of Kensington and Chelsea.

The Guide is organised in four sections:

Section One, Jobs and Advice, has the details about places where you can either find work or where you will be given help in looking for work. Many of the organisations listed here can help you with career choices, CVs, application forms, interview techniques and confidence-building.

Section Two, Training and Education, lists the places where you can find further education and get training for specific jobs. Most of these organisations train you in particular skills for specific jobs while others, like the colleges listed, have a wide range of different courses that can help you to find work.

**Section Three**, Self Employment and Business Start-up, contains the organisations which can help you in setting up your own business or in strengthening your current enterprise.

**Section Four**, Information and Services, has details of organisations which can help unemployed people and those in work with things like benefit claims, housing problems, childcare and refugee issues.

## **Section One**

# **Jobcentre Plus**

Jobcentre Plus is a government agency supporting people of working age (18 to 65) from welfare into work, and helping employers to fill their vacancies.

Jobcentre Plus customers will primarily be in receipt of Jobseekers Allowance, Income Support or Employment Support Allowance (previously Incapacity Benefit).

Jobcentre Plus will provide practical support and financial advice about benefits, tax credits, childcare, training, work and looking for a job.

Their advisers can:

- Give advice on training options available
- Give advice on local opportunities such as volunteering and work trials
- Advise on job opportunities and assist with applications
- Work out how much better customers could be in work

- Give advice on childcare and any help available with costs together with access to childcare information services

- Help with applying for in work benefits.

They have specialist advisers for certain client groups for example lone parents, sick and disabled customers and young people.

Jobcentre Plus also has a job brokerage arm and customers have access to a vast number of vacancies (these can also be accessed by people who are not Jobcentre Plus customers).


