

# MEET YOUR VERY OWN LORD LEIGHTON

1830 ~ 1896

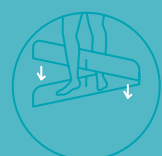
Frederic Leighton was a famous Victorian painter and sculptor. He lived in London but travelled around Europe and to the Middle East frequently. He admired and collected Islamic tiles, pottery and fabrics and built his house – today's Leighton House Museum – as an artist studio house where he lived and painted all his masterpieces.

He had many friends and liked to socialise with them, hosting music, dance, conversation events in his beautiful house. He became the President of the Royal Academy of Arts in 1878, a respected position that required him to wear an official red robe and a chain. Queen Victoria awarded him the title of Baron shortly before his death and he became known as Frederic Lord Leighton. You can visit Leighton's house at 12 Holland Park Road.

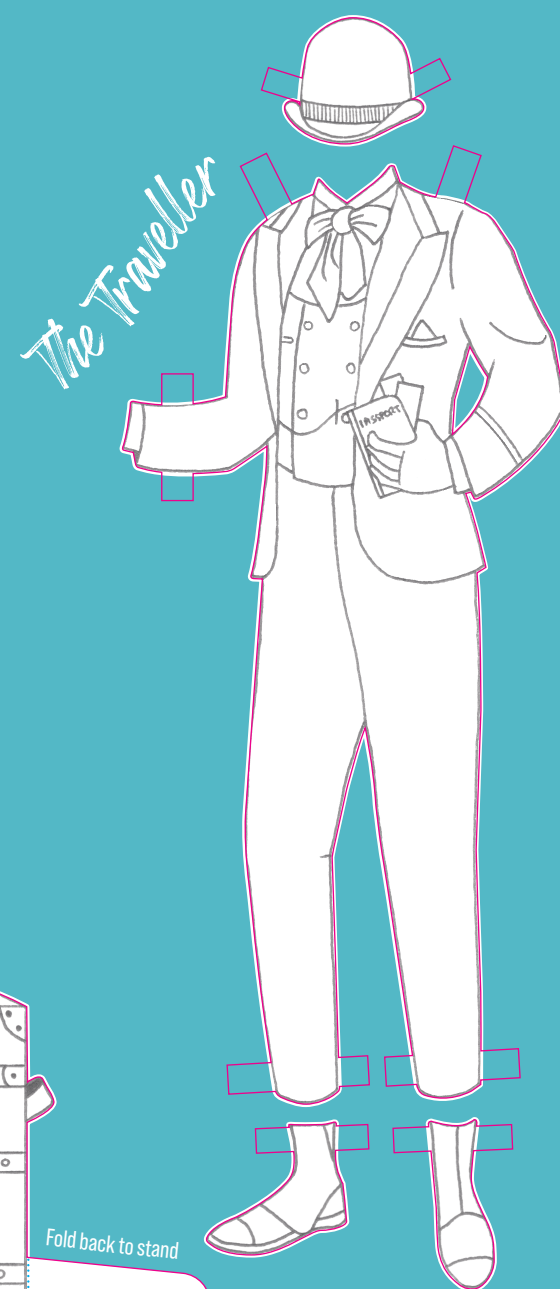
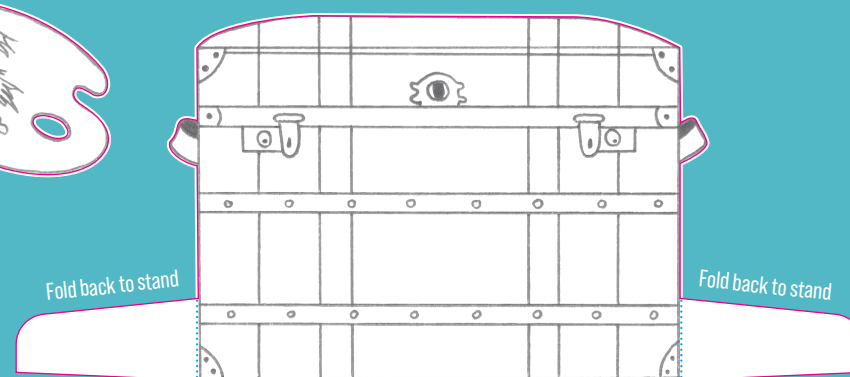
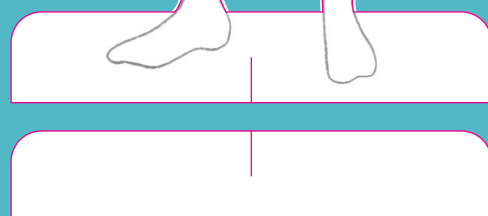
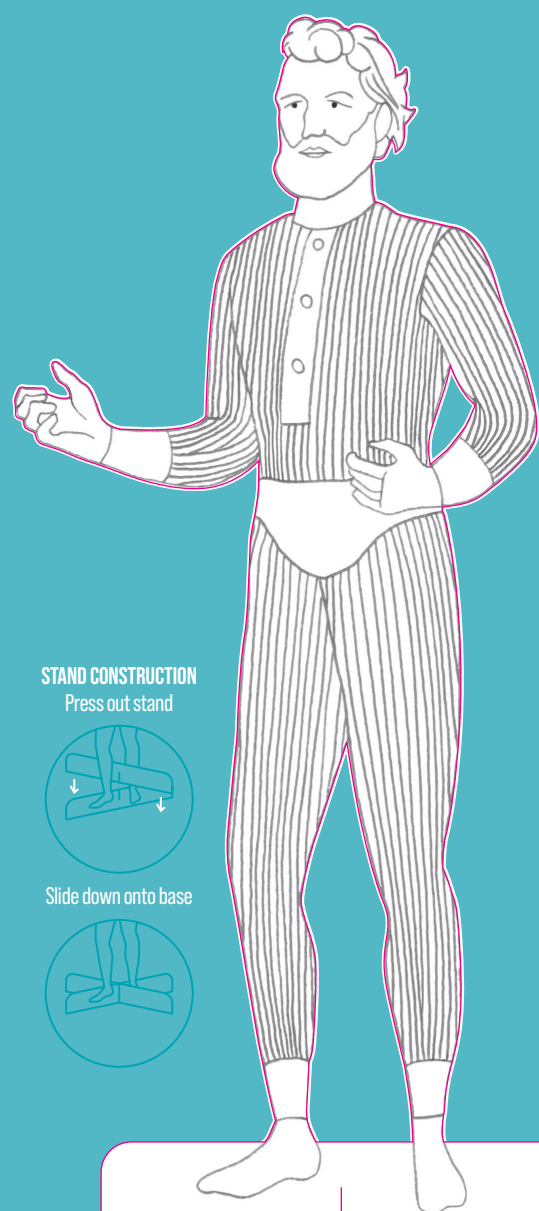

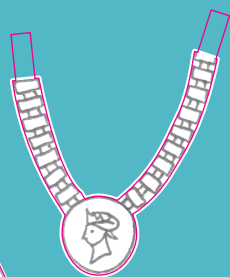
STAND CONSTRUCTION  
Press out stand



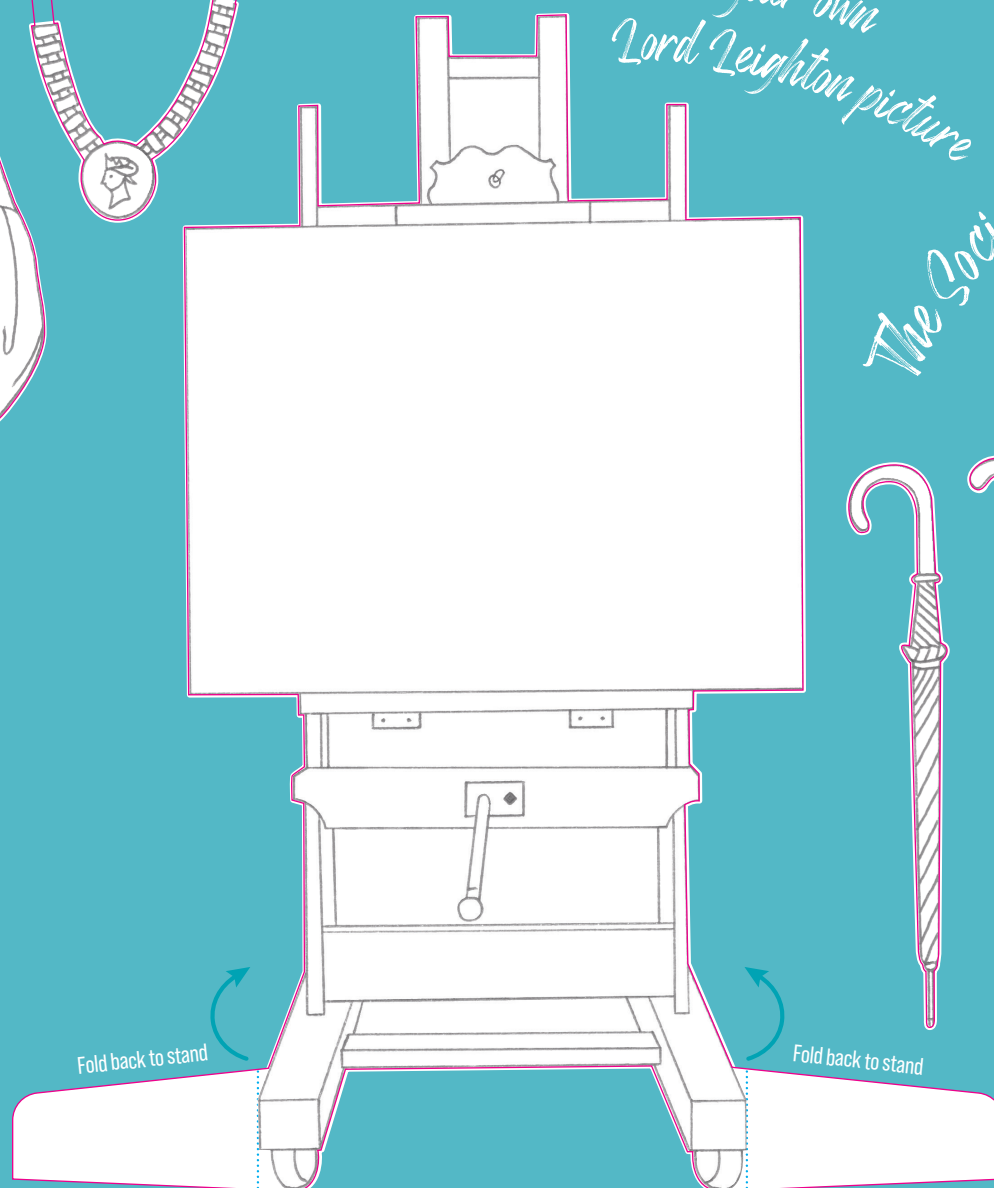
Slide down onto base



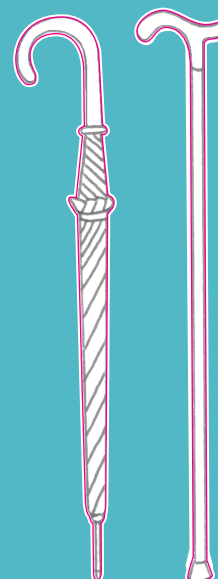
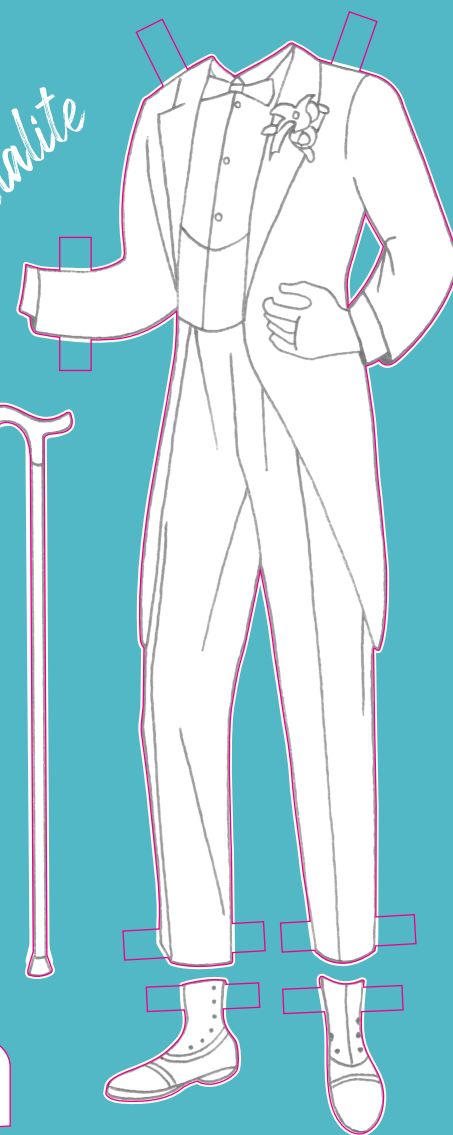
