As the Senior Curator for both houses, I wanted to write to you personally to assure you that we have not taken this decision lightly.

All our public events have been cancelled and this includes costumed and conventional tours, pre-booked visits from schools and community groups and our free Holland Park guided walks. If you have booked a ticket, you will receive a separate message with details about how to receive a full refund.
