I refer to the current Listed building and consent to display advertisement applications in relation to the above property. I would like to take this opportunity to inform you that the property is a Grade II* Listed building, within the Kensington Square Conservation Area and within the Kensington High Street Principal Shopping Centre. Your proposal would be judged against policies within the "Conservation and Development" and "Shopping" chapter of the UDP, in particular policies CD44, CD52, CD53, CD58, CD64, CD68 and S10 and S11.

Following the investigation of the above applications I am of the considered opinion that your proposal could not be recommended favourably to the Planning Services Committee. It is considered that signage on this site should be conceived as part of the building, which includes the GAP and Marks and Spencers, and not in isolation. The high level sign and the projecting sign are unacceptable in principle as are perspex illuminated letters. The signs should be restrained in scale and number, of high quality materials and subtle illumination.

I would suggest that the applications are amended so that the high level sign and the projecting sign are deleted from the scheme. The most appropriate position for a sign is on the stone frieze above the entrance but not on the lower level panel above the doors as shown on your drawing as sign two. Opaque letters, with a metal powder coated finish, with halo illumination would be acceptable mounted individually on the frieze. The letters should not be deeper than the frieze.

I look forward to receiving your revised drawings in the near future in order the matter can be dealt with expediently. If however, I have not received revised drawings by the 24th January 2001 I shall take it you know longer wish to proceed with your application and shall treat them as withdrawn.

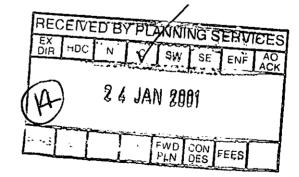

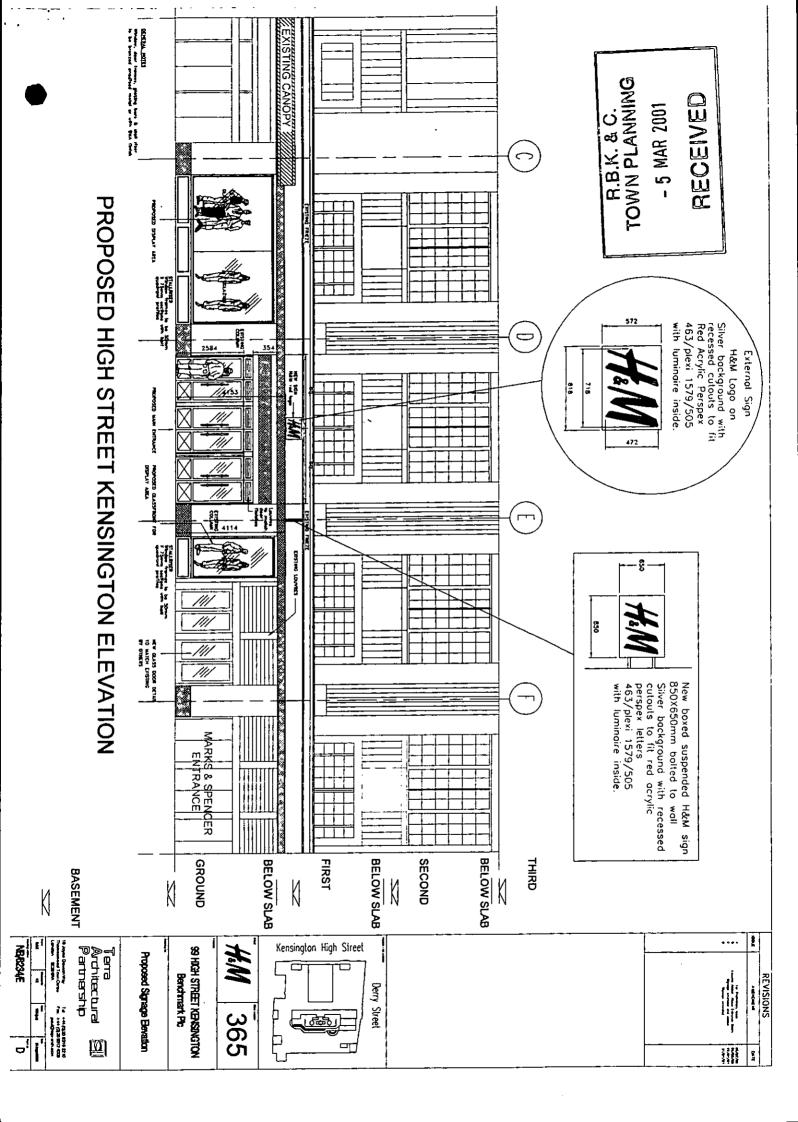
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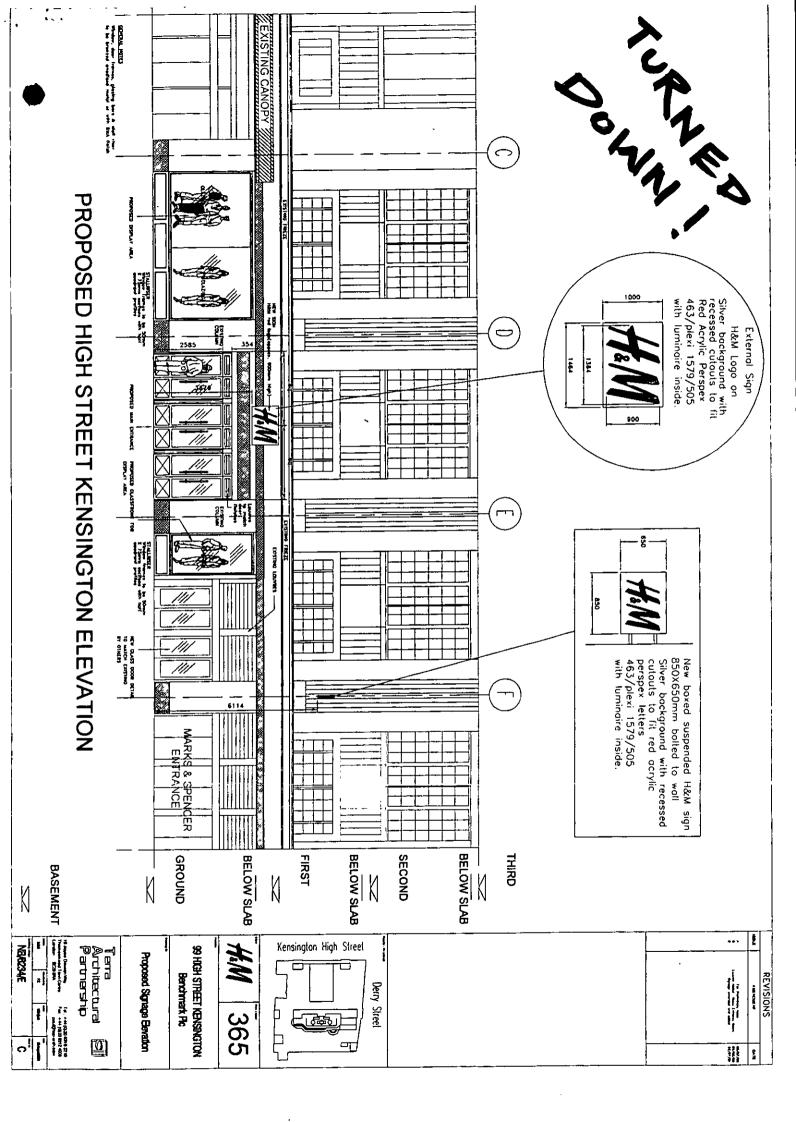

I refer to the letter from Mr. Paul Kelsey, dated 26th January 2001, received on the 01st February 2001.

Mr. Simon Plowman had contacted TAP by telephone, a few days before we received the letter mentioned in the above paragraph, explaining the discrepancies with the Signage Proposal. Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act, 1990 Town and Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) Regulations, 1992 99 Kensington High Street, London, W8

I refer to our earlier correspondence regarding the current Listed building, advertisement applications and enforcement investigation with regard to signage at the H&M store at the above property. I also refer to the meeting earlier today at 10:30 between yourself and Mr Davies and Mr Plowman of this Department.

I would like to clarify advice in my letter to you of the 26th January 2001 and confirm advice given to you at the above meeting. Projecting signs are not considered to be appropriate at this location under any circumstances. The only signage that would be acceptable would be fixed flat against the stone fascia to fit within the dimensions of the fascia, it should not extend above or below it. The signs should be opaque with light only permitted to shine through the front face of the letters. The finish should either be enamelled or powder coated aluminium, the front face of the letters may be perspex. Three such signs would be considered to be appropriate.

If you would like any of the above points clarifying please contact my assistant, Simon Plowman, on the above telephone number. I look forward to receiving further revised drawings in order that these applications can be dealt with expediently and the possibility of enforcement proceedings being avoided by the removal of the unauthorised projecting signs.

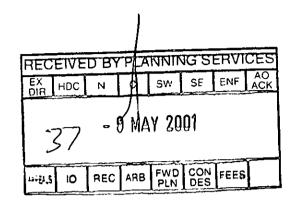

Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 Town and Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) Regulations 1992 Re: 99 Kensington High Street SW8 Signage on H&M shop

Further to your conversation on the 19th October 2001 with my officer Mr. Van Well, regarding the advertisement signs on the above mentioned property.

I would inform you that that the current signage on the building does not have Listed Building Consent and Advertisement Consent, and that it would be unlikely to receive a favourable recommendation from the Planning Services Committee.

The only signage that would be acceptable would be three pairs of initials as shown on your drawing number NB/6234/E. However, the letters should be attached directly to the stonework and not on a backing fascia, just like the Marks & Spencer signage next to the H&M shop. The method of illumination should be subtle and low key, like halo-lighting.

In these circumstances I would advise you to send in revised drawing with the above mentioned amendments. However, I would remind you that advise given by officers is without prejudice to any future decision of the Planning Services Committee.

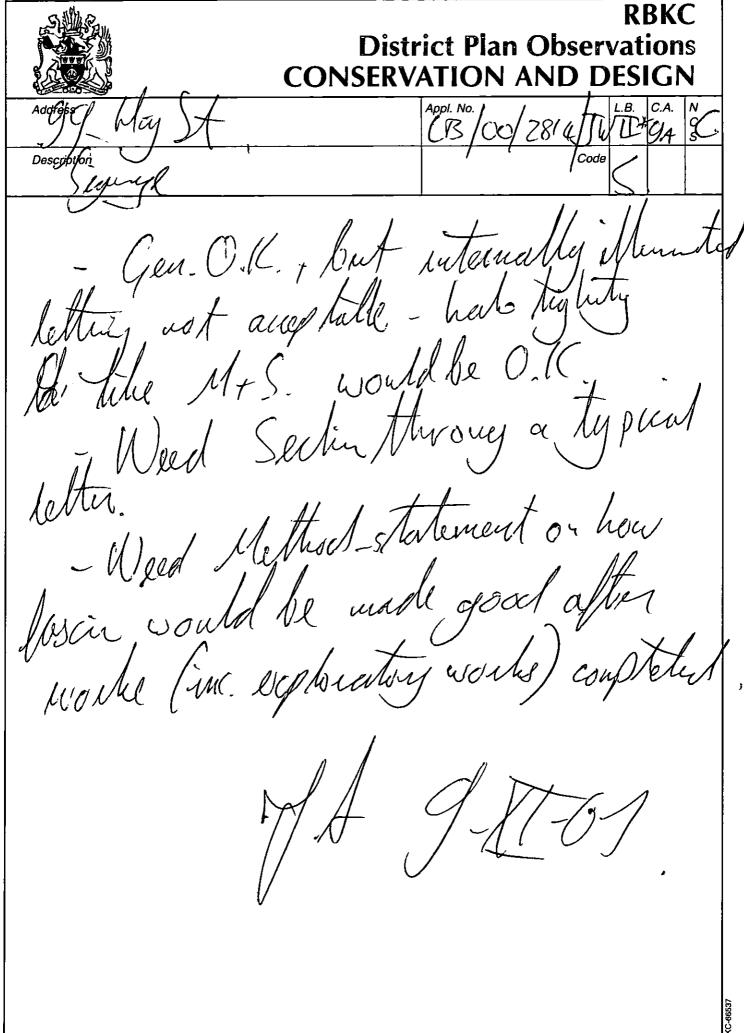

Further to your letter of 19/10/01 regarding the Signage on the H&M shop, we would like to reply as follow:

We have amended the signage as suggested (Drawings enclosed)

However, having consulted the Contractors for this project, we have a practical problem in erecting signs without backings.

Individual signs have previously been attempted on this façade, but due to the nature of the structure behind the façade, it is impossible to drill through at the correct location.

There are only certain locations that will allow penetration. This can only be identified by trial and error. This can result in several holes in the façade before the sign can be fixed. We can also not guarantee that the sign will then be positioned at the required location.

The previously proposed sign with a silver backing was agreed with Simon Plowman (as per drawing no NB/6234/E Rev E) We would ask for this arrangement to be reconsidered.

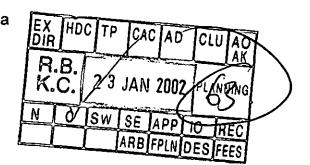
