

To help progress the detail design, our structural engineer has requested that certain opening up works are carried out as soon as possible to assess the original construction and present condition of Nightingale. It is intended that these will be carried out subject to the following restrictions:

No original decorative plasterwork (ie cornices) to be disturbed.

23 Floorboards (and any other joinery items) to be carefully removed and retained on site

Investigations to foundations/footings to be the minimum necessary and reinstated as soon as practicable.

We would be pleased if you could confirm that the carrying out of these operations will be acceptable and will not necessitate any revision to the listed building consent granted.







I refer to your letter dated 18th May 2004 regarding alterations to the planning permission and listed building consent dated 7th November 2003 for the property.
