Proposed Awnings to the rear of 23 Tregunter Road, London SW10

I refer to your letters of 30 April and 22 May and to my letter of 13 May.

I fully appreciate that the subject of my awning must be a very long way down your Planning & Conservation Committee's list and I also much appreciate the trouble you have taken personally over this matter.

However, I do not think that the question of my awning has been considered properly and I feel the decision to refuse my application is unreasonable. I therefore will be taking the best available professional advice and any other action that I believe is necessary before appealing to the Secretary of State for the Department of Transport, Local Government and the Regions. I am having the first meeting concerning this matter with two separate advisers on Wednesday 26 June. I believe I should inform you that I am going ahead with this appeal so please treat this letter as confirmation of that fact.
