I have recently bought a flat in Coronation Court, where I am living with my young daughter and have some concerns about the above proposed development.

: 1

- Parking: already in the evening it can be very difficult finding a parking space for residents, presumably because of extra people coming to the pub, The North Pole, I have often had to park a long way from Brewster Gardens. I am concerned that with a restaurant on the corner, this would become even more difficult. With a block of flats like Coronation Court in Brewster Gardens, there are a lot of cars for few spaces, I would like to hear what provision has been made for extra traffic in the area.
- 2. **Noise:** because customers to the restaurant will invariably be parking in Brewster Gardens, I am concerned about the extra noise value in the evening.
- 3. Smell: I have already contacted environmental health about the smell that comes from either the fried chicken or the fish and chip shop on North Pole Rd. The smell of stale frying oil pervades at times most of the way up Brewster Gardens (a long way!), and throughout my flat in Coronation Court if I open my window. Sitting on my balcony would be quite unpleasant. I am seriously concerned about summertime in this respect, when I will want to be on the balcony, and when windows are opened more. I would like to know where the ventilation for the restaurant is directed, is it going to be directed out the back, and therefore into Brewster Gardens? I am hoping the plans are not for another fried food restaurant, as this is definitely the worst in terms of smell. I would very much like some assurance that the question of smell for residents living nearby has been addressed.

I have tried today to phone you and will continue to try to get through, but in the meantime send this off to you and I look forward to hearing from you in this respect. Thank you.

Some time last year, local residents had to call your public health department to deal with rats in the vicinity. There will be severe noise and disturbance resulting from such a use.




