

ENFORCEMENT NOTICE
(Operational Development)

ISSUED BY: The Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea ("the Council")

1. **THIS IS A FORMAL NOTICE** which is issued by the Council because it appears to them that there has been a breach of planning control, under Section 171A(1)(a) of the above Act, at the land described below. They consider that it is expedient to issue this notice, having regard to the provisions of the development plan and to other material planning considerations.

2. **THE LAND AFFECTED**

Land at 1 Kenway Road, London SW5, shown edged red on the attached plan.

3. **THE BREACH OF PLANNING CONTROL ALLEGED**

Without planning permission, the installation of a satellite dish on the front elevation of the property at second floor level.

4. **REASONS FOR ISSUING THIS NOTICE**

It appears to the Council that the above breach of planning control has occurred within the last four years. The installation of the satellite dish on the front elevation of the property has a detrimental effect on the visual amenity of the area and represents an intrusive and unsympathetic form of development. The development therefore runs contrary to the Council's policies as set out in the adopted Unitary Development Plan, in particular Policies CD25, CD44 and CD45.

5. **WHAT YOU ARE REQUIRED TO DO.**

Remove the satellite dish from the front elevation of 1 Kenway Road, London SW5.

Time for compliance: One calendar month after this notice takes effect.

6. WHEN THIS NOTICE TAKES EFFECT

This notice takes effect on 10th September 1996 unless an appeal is made against it beforehand.

ANNEX

YOUR RIGHT OF APPEAL

You can appeal against this notice, but any appeal must be received, or posted in time to be received, by the Secretary of State before 10th September 1996. The enclosed booklet "Enforcement Appeals - A Guide to Procedure" sets out your rights. Read it carefully. You may use the enclosed appeal forms. One is for you to send to the Secretary of State if you decide to appeal. The second is to be returned to the Council at the same time. The third is for you to keep as a duplicate for your own records. You should also send the Secretary of State the spare copy of this enforcement notice which is enclosed.

WHAT HAPPENS IF YOU DO NOT APPEAL

If you do not appeal against this enforcement notice, it will take effect on 10th September 1996 and you must ensure that the required steps for complying with it, for which you may be held responsible, are taken within the period(s) specified in this notice. Failure to comply with an enforcement notice which has taken effect can result in prosecution and/or remedial action by the Council.
