## Statement of Community Involvement update 2019

The Council wants to refresh the way we involve residents and other stakeholders in planning matters and place making. We are updating our Statement of Community Involvement (SCI) and undertaking pre-consultation conversations before we draft the SCI document for consultation.

The updated SCI will cover three main areas and set out a range of consultation methods that will be used for the following:

1. Planning Policy
2. Planning Applications
3. Neighbourhood Planning

Stages in the preparation of the updated SCI will follow;

1. Pre engagement and consider comments received
2. Consultation on Draft Document
3. Consider Comments and Adoption

We are at the pre-engagement stage and we would very much like to hear your views on what should be included.
