Notice is hereby given pursuant to Section 123 of the Local Government Act 1972 (as amended by Section 118 of the Local Government Planning and Land Act 1980) that Kensington and Chelsea Council intends to transfer ownership of a portion of the freehold land adjacent to Grenfell Tower in the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea being land currently laid out as a playground and amenity land adjoining Grenfell Tower.

Details of this proposal and a plan of the said land are available for inspection, free of charge, during normal office hours, Monday to Friday, at the Customer Services Reception of Kensington and Chelsea Council, Kensington Town Hall, Hornton Street, London, W8 7NX. 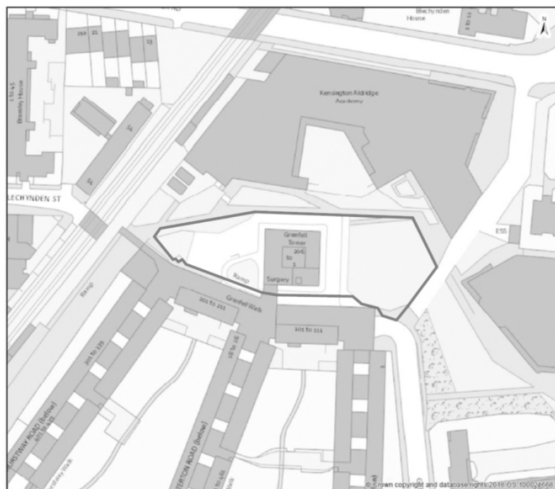

Details of the proposal

It is proposed that, included as part of the transfer of Grenfell Tower to the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government, Kensington and Chelsea Council are to transfer ownership of a portion of the freehold land adjacent to Grenfell Tower in the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea. The total area of land which it is proposed will be transferred (including land that may be considered open space) is edged red on the plan and comprises 3,093 square metres or thereabouts.

The transfer of ownership of this portion of freehold land adjacent to Grenfell Tower is proposed so that the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government can take responsibility for the site until its long-term future has been determined by the Grenfell Tower Memorial Commission. This is in keeping with the wishes of the bereaved, survivors and the local community. It is part of the progression towards the establishment of a fitting memorial on the site, as set out in a document entitled "Principles Governing Consultations on the Future of the Grenfell Tower Site", to which the Council, the Ministry, Grenfell United and the Lancaster West Residents' Association are all signatories.
