It sets out the borough's approach and procedures in respect of planning obligations (financial and non-financial where appropriate). The Local Plan 2019 policies were subject to an Integrated Impact Assessment (IA). The IIA assessed the impact of the Local Plan policies on Equalities. The assessment is set out in Section 9.4 of the submission report. This followed a Health and Equalities Workshop held in June 2016, which raised the concern of a lack of venues for volunteer, charity and public sector organisations to carry out their community work affordably or effectively. The baseline information on which equalities assessment was based is set out in the IIA Scoping Report at Section 7.6.</li> <li>Section 9.4 of the IIA explains how equalities groups have been considered and summarises the assessment on equalities of the Local Plan policies. The residual effect of Local Plan Policies, including Policy C1 is that it will have a positive effect on equalities.
