Environmental checks

Residents attended a community event on Saturday 20 July on the environmental checks programme. This is a two stage process and the laboratory analysis of Stage 1 by the independent specialist, AECOM, is now complete and the preliminary data available. This information will let us know if the soil has been contaminated by the Grenfell Tower fire and whether there are any health risks as a result.

At this point the level of substances found in samples are typical of those found generally in London and other urban areas and there is nothing to suggest any immediate action and changes to the investigation strategy or the health advice from Public Health England are needed. There is more work to be done to analyse the data and the full report on Stage 1 will be published online in September. Stage 2 will involve more detailed sampling and analysis leading to a report which will provide conclusions and recommendations. To read more, visit

Carnival virtuoso celebrated with Mayor's Award

Carnival has been a huge part of North Kensington life for the past six decades. In the early days of Carnival, community leader and activist Clive Phillip felt compelled to bring his culture with him from Trinidad and Tobago as he settled in London.

Clive is one of the founders of the Mangrove Steel Band that was formed in 1980 to introduce steel band and carnival culture to the local young people in North Kensington, ensuring

Caribbean art forms would pass down generations.

Clive said: "Carnival is my whole life; my whole life is based around Carnival. The kids are the band now, there are classes for all age groups".

The band is one of the longest standing steel bands in Europe and provides an outlet for residents both young and old to work together and build community spirit.

Eight-time winners of Panorama, the UK's National Steel Pan competition, the group has grown tremendously over the decades with people joining from far and wide, enticed by the group's feelgood spirit and music.

Clive said: "The band takes kids off the street and provides an after-school club service where they can rehearse and perform all year round."

Earlier this year, Clive received a Mayor's Award for his contributions to Carnival and role he and the steel band play in the community and across the whole country. The band instils discipline, provides

high quality music education and performance opportunities across Europe, bringing the joy of music to people from all backgrounds.

With music at the heart of Carnival, extra rehearsal and preparation is taking place ahead of the August bank holiday, when elaborate floats and colourful costumed performers will wind their way through

the streets in the carnival parades.

Have you had your enhanced health check?

The NHS is advising local residents concerned about their health to contact their GP and ask about the enhanced health check. These are designed to find the early signs of health problems or underlying health conditions.

Dr Brannick, GP and Clinical Lead for North Kensington, said: "During the enhanced health check we look for signs of long term conditions such as diabetes and lung problems and provide physical health checks looking at weight gain, blood pressure and cholesterol levels."

"They also look at your emotional wellbeing and will give advice on improving your health through lifestyle changes."

Your GP will either do these or refer you to another GP practice which does. If you prefer they are also available at various clinics in North Kensington via our community provider enhance who you can call on **020 3434 2500**.

If further investigations are required they will refer you on to specialist services including the respiratory clinic at St Mary's Hospital, Praed Street, W2 1NY
