On adoption the community priorities within it will guide ward member decisions on NCIL spending.</p> <p>Resources: The document has been prepared within the existing staff and budget resources of the Planning Policy Team. Implementation of the framework will utilise existing staff and budget resources of Planning Policy and Community Engagement.</p>

The purpose of the document is to set out the community priorities in the borough. These have been identified by residents through consultation. All sections of the community will be able to put forward projects for NCIL funding. Projects may be wide ranging and may relate to the protected characteristics.

All projects put forward will be considered by Ward Members. The community priorities will guide their decisions on the allocation of NCIL funds towards projects.

	<p>The Council consulted on NCIL Community Priorities for six-weeks between 11 February and 24 March 2020 using polls through the digital platform Built-ID and the Councils planning consultation portal / email. The digital platform enabled publicity of the consultation to a very wide audience using adverts on social media – Facebook, Instagram, Twitter and Google to invite users to participate in polls and answer questions.</p> <p>The Local Planning Authority has a Local Plan consultation database which has in excess of 2,000 consultees. Local Plan database includes ‘general’, ‘specific’, ‘prescribed’ and ‘local’ consultation bodies as required by legislation. The ‘general consultation’ bodies includes bodies which represent the interests of different equalities groups such as Action Disability Kensington and Chelsea, Age Concern, Open Age Charity, a number of religious churches and Black and Minority Ethnic Health Forum.</p> <p>594 people responded through the online poll and 30 via the planning portal consultation and email. Every ward in the borough was represented. Respondents selected the priorities most important to them for their ward. The responses have been used to identify the community priorities set out in the document.</p> <p>Two comments were received from borough residents which referred to disability. One suggested a priority relating to accessibility for those with disabilities. Projects relating to this protected characteristic can be encompassed within any of the community priorities. For example, a project to provide level access to an open space or park would fall within the priority “parks and open spaces”.
