

NEWSPAPER ADVERTISEMENT

THE ROYAL BOROUGH OF KENSINGTON AND CHELSEA On at least one occasion during the period of **10 working days**, starting on the day after the day on which the application was submitted to the Council, you must publish a notice in a local newspaper circulating in the Kensington and Chelsea area. The applicant shall forward a complete copy of the newspaper containing the advertisement to the Council. (The Council does not consider the *Evening Standard* to be a local newspaper.)

Any person wishing to submit representations to my/our application must give notice in writing to the licensing authority at the address shown above, giving in detail the grounds of objection by (f)....../20.....

The Council will not entertain representations where the writer requests that his identity remains anonymous. Copies of all representations will be included in the papers presented to the Licensing Sub-Committee and will therefore pass into the public domain. Representations must relate to one of the four Licensing Objectives: the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance and the protection of children from harm. In the case of an application for a provisional statement, please note that representations will be restricted once a statement has been issued.

It is an offence liable on conviction to a fine under Section 158 of the Licensing Act 2003 to knowingly or recklessly make a false statement in connection with this application.

Notes: (a) full name of applicant; (b) applicant's address; (c) full details of application, including type of licence, licensable activities and hours sought, and any other relevant information. If variation of a licence is sought give details of the current licence and proposed variation; (d) name of premises; (e) address of premises; (f) the last date for representations should be written in the format dd/mm/yyyy and calculated as 28 days from the date on which the notice is displayed.
