
Colville Ward Profile







The Census occurs once every ten years, the most recent of which fell on 27 March 2011. This report gives a summary of Census data for Colville ward.

In 2014, each ward in Kensington and Chelsea had changes made to its ward boundaries meaning that no Census data exists specifically for these new wards by the Office for National Statistics. To alleviate the data gap, this summary uses Output Areas (OAs) as the building blocks for the new wards. OAs are the smallest Census geography, containing circa 150 residents. OAs are allocated using a best fit model, therefore ensure that these profiles are treated, and the numbers they contain, as being illustrative only.

For ease of use Census data has been subdivided into three distinct themes:

Who we are...

Introduction

Population, ethnic group, country of birth, passports held, religion, health

- How we live...

Marital status, living arrangements, household composition, accommodation, tenure, car or van availability, overcrowding

- What we do...

Economic activity, hours worked, qualifications and students, industry, occupation, unpaid care

Disclaimer: All data relates to the Census 2011 figures released by the ONS and all figures are rounded to one decimal place in the text and to one significant figure in the charts.

Headline data

Rankings are for the 18 wards in the borough and are sorted in descending order.

In Colville...

- ...the usual residents population is 9,434. The workplace population is 8,799 a decrease of 6.7 per cent compared to the usual residents population.
- ... the population density is 201.6 people per square hectare, ranked 2nd highest and compares to 130.8 in the borough.
- ... English is the main language for 78.0 per cent of residents (7,121).
- ...2.5 per cent of residents speak French as a first language, 2.1 per cent speak Arabic and 2.5 per cent speak Spanish as a first language.
- ...67.9 per cent of all residents are classified as having a White ethnicity.
- ...2.9 per cent of residents gave their ethnicity as Arab, the 13th highest percentage in the borough.

- ...36.0 per cent of residents gave a nationality that relates to Britain or Northern Ireland, ranked 5th in the borough, comparable to the average of 30.9 in Kensington and Chelsea and 38.3 per cent in London.
- ...57.5 per cent of residents were born in the UK compared to 50.1 per cent in Kensington and Chelsea.
- ...11.8 per cent of residents arrived in the UK within the last seven years.
- ...66.8 per cent of residents have a UK passport.
- ...28.0 per cent of households are owner occupied, a decrease of 3.5 percentage points, whereas the private rented sector has increased by 10.1 percentage points to 28.6 per cent of households.
- ...62.6 per cent of households do not have access to a car or van, compared to the borough average of 56.0 per cent.
- ...49.7 per cent of residents have a level 4 (degree equivalent or above) qualification.
- ...31.1 per cent of working residents work more than 49 hours per week.


Who we are...

Population Overall

The population of Colville is 9,434, the 9th highest populated ward in the borough. The population of Kensington and Chelsea decreased by 0.2 per cent from 158,896 to 158,649 residents from 2001 to 2011.


Population Age

Figure 1 shows the age structure of Colville compared to England and Wales split by gender, and notably shows higher numbers of residents aged between 25 and 34. In Colville, 22.7 per cent of residents are aged less than 24, 66.9 per cent between 24-64 (of working age) and 10.5 per cent are aged over 65 (i.e. of pensionable age). In Kensington and Chelsea overall, 25.9 per cent are aged less than 24, 62.1 per cent between 24 and 64 and 12.0 per cent aged 65 and over.




Population Density

Colville has a population density (see figure 2) of 201.6 people per hectare (ranked 2nd), compared to 130.8 in Kensington and Chelsea and 52.0 people per hectare in London. The high density can be attributed to the large number of multi-storey flats in the area, lack of large open spaces such as parks and other large retail, business or infrastructure instalments that reduce the amount of residential spaces.



Ethnic Group

Figure 3 shows the broad ethnic groups in Colville, Kensington and Chelsea and London. The **White group** makes up 67.9 per cent, the **Mixed group** makes up 6.7 per cent, the **Asian group** makes up 7.6 per cent, the **Black group** makes up 12.3 per cent, the **Arab group** makes up 2.9 per cent and the **Other Ethnicity group** makes up the remaining 2.7 per cent.




41.5 per cent of residents identified themselves as White: English/Welsh/Scottish/Northern Irish/British and a further 23.5 per cent of residents identified themselves as Other White.

2.2 per cent of residents (209) identified their ethnicity as **Other Mixed**, ranked 4th in the borough.

4.4 per cent of residents (415) identified their ethnicity as **Other Asian**, ranked 10th in the borough.

5.3 per cent of residents (499) identified their ethnicity as **African**, ranked 4th in the borough.




Religion

Figure 5 shows the spread of religions in Colville compared with the borough and London averages. Overall the majority, 48.3 per cent, of the population of Colville are **Christian** (4,561 residents, ranked 17th), 9.4 per cent are **Muslim** (883 residents, ranked 8th) and 26.0 per cent have **no religion** (2,457 residents, ranked 2nd).




Language

In Colville, **English** is the main language for all occupants in 78.0 per cent of all households (7,121 residents, ranked 3rd). 2.5 per cent of residents speak **Spanish** as a main language (232 residents, ranked 13th). 2.5 per cent speak **French** as a main language (228 residents, ranked 13th).



Proficiency in English

For 76.0 per cent of residents, **English** is the main language (ranked 3rd) and where English is not their main language, 12.2 per cent speak English **very well** (ranked 13th) and 6.6 per cent speak English **well** (ranked 15th). 2.2 per cent **cannot speak English well** (ranked 8th) and 0.4 per cent **cannot speak English** (ranked 3rd).



National Identity

36.0 per cent of residents gave a national identity that relates to **Britain or Northern Ireland** (3,395 residents, ranked 5th) compared to 30.9 per cent in the borough and 38.3 per cent in London (*figure 8*).



Health


Overall, Kensington and Chelsea is ranked first in England and Wales for the percentage of residents that assess their health as **very good** (57.8 per cent compared to 50.5 per cent in London). In Colville 54.3 per cent of residents assess their health as **very good** and 28.5 per cent selected **good health**. 4.6 per cent of residents assess their health as **bad** (ranked 6th) and 1.6 per cent as **very bad** (ranked 4th). This is higher than the London average (3.7 per cent and 1.2 per cent).

Long Term Limiting Illness

15.1 per cent of residents in Colville have a **long term limiting illness** (1,423 residents, ranked 6th), compared to 12.3 per cent in Kensington and Chelsea and 14.1 per cent in London.

Length of Residence in UK and Age of Arrival in the UK (Please Note: Figures Relate to 2011)

55.4 per cent of residents of Colville were born in the UK, 24.4 per cent of residents arrived more than 10 years ago (2,304 residents, ranked 10th), 8.4 per cent in the last five to 10 years (792 residents, ranked 14th) and 11.8 per cent arrived in the last five years (1,111 residents).



Of those **not born in the UK** 27.1 per cent of residents arrived in the UK aged between **0-19**, 68.2 per cent between **20-44**, 3.9 per cent between the ages of **45-64** and 0.8 per cent **65 plus** when they arrived in the UK.

Who we are...

World Regions (figure 10)

Figure 10 shows country of birth by number and per cent of residents in Colville and Kensington and Chelsea by world region and figure 11 shows the number and percentage for selected European countries. Overall 52.4 per cent of residents in Colville were born in **England** (4,940 residents, ranked 5th), higher than the borough average of 45.6 per cent.


2.3 per cent of residents (220 residents, ranked 18th) were born in the **Middle East**, 2.0 per cent lower than the borough average. Colville residents were also born in **North America** (399 residents, 4.2 per cent, ranked 13th), **South East Asia** (250 residents, 2.7 per cent, ranked 13th), **Eastern Asia** (124 residents, 1.3 per cent, ranked 14th) and residents born in the **UK and Ireland** (5,418 residents, 57.5 per cent, ranked 6th).

Europe (figure 11)

2.4 per cent of the population of Colville were born in **France** (22 residents, ranked 13th) compared to 4.2 per cent in the borough. 2.0 per cent of residents were born in **Italy** (187 residents, ranked 13th), 1.6 per cent in **Germany** (155 residents, ranked 12th) and 1.5 per cent in **Spain** (144 residents, ranked 12th).

Passports Held (figure 12)


66.8 per cent of residents in Colville have a **UK pass- port** (6,397 residents, ranked 6th), 8.8 per cent higher
than the borough average. Excluding the UK and Ireland, 14.8 per cent of residents have another **European passport** (1,413 residents, ranked 12th). 2.8 per cent of
residents in Colville have a passport from the **Middle East and Asia** (265 residents, ranked 16th).



How we live...

Accommodation Type

Flats account for 89.8 per cent of all household spaces in Colville (4,328 households, ranked 3rd) compared to 83.1 per cent in the borough and 52.2 per cent in London. **Houses** account for 10.2 per cent of household spaces (491 households ranked 16th) in Colville compared to 16.9 per cent in the borough and 47.8 per cent in London).



Tenure

28.0 per cent of households in Colville are **owner occupiers (including shared ownership)** (1,375 households, ranked 15th) compared to 36.6 per cent in the borough and 49.5 per cent in London.

The **private rented** sector accounts for 28.6 per cent of households (1,405 households, ranked 13th), and compares to 35.8 per cent in the borough and 25.1 per cent in London.

Social rented properties in the borough and London account for 24.5 and 24.1 per cent respectively and 43.5 per cent in Colville (2,137 properties, ranked 5th).



Overcrowding (Bedroom Score)

An occupancy score of -1 or less shows that there is at least one too few bedrooms to adequately accommodate the individuals residing in a household. 9.9 per cent of households in Colville are **overcrowded** (491 households, ranked 5th). This compares to 8.3 per cent of households in the borough and 11.3 per cent in London.

Marital and Civil Partnership Status

55.2 per cent of adult residents are **single** (4,476 residents, ranked 2nd), compared to 48.2 per cent in the borough and 44.1 per cent in London. 26.9 per cent are **married** (including civil partnerships) (2,181, ranked 18th) compared to 36.3 per cent in the borough and 40.2 per cent in London. 3.4 per cent are **separated**, 10.7 per cent are **divorced** and 3.7 per cent are **widowed**


Household Composition

One person households (where the occupant is aged less than 65 years) account for 39.3 per cent of households in Colville (1,952 households, ranked 5th), compared to 36.0 per cent in the borough (*figure 15*).

Pensioner households (including lone, family and other pensioners) account for 12.0 per cent of households (599, ranked 12th), lower than the borough average (13.6 per cent). **Single pensioner households** account for 10.5 per cent (523, ranked 8th) (*figure 15*).

Lone parent households make up 11.7 per cent (583, ranked 5th) in Colville, higher than the borough average of 8.2 per cent (*figure 15*).

Cohabiting couples make up 9.9 per cent (491 households, ranked 2nd). **Married couples** (including civil partnerships) account for 16.2 per cent of households (805 households, ranked 18th) (*figure 15*).





How we live...

Second Homes

A second home is an address at which a person stays for more than 30 days per year that is not a person's place of usual residence (this might include people working away from home, a student's home address or a holiday home etc.). In Colville, 11.7 per cent of households are classified as a **second address** (1,103 households, ranked 14th).

Of these, 50.5 per cent are second addresses in the UK (557 households, ranked 4th) and 49.5 per cent are outside the UK (546 households, ranked 15th).




Household Deprivation

Household deprivation is used to classify households that fall within any or all of the four deprivation characteristics:

- Employment: person within a household not a fulltime student who is unemployed or long term sick,
- Education: no person in the household has at least level 2 education and no person aged 16-18 is a fulltime student,
- 3. Health and disability: any person in the household has general health 'bad or very bad' or has a long term health problem.
- 4. Housing: where accommodation is either overcrowded, with an occupancy rating -1 or less, or is in a shared dwelling, or has no central heating.

In Colville, 35.4 per cent of households have **one dimension of deprivation**, 18.2 per cent have two, 7.1 per cent have three and 1.2 per cent have four. 38.1 per



cent of households in Colville are **not deprived in any dimension** compared to the borough average of 43.6 per cent.

Access to a Car or Van

62.6 per cent of households in Colville do not have access to a car or van (3,110, ranked 4th).

31.3 per cent of residents in Colville have access to **one car**, 5.0 per cent have access to **two cars**, 0.8 per cent have access to three cars and 0.3 per cent have access to **four or more cars**.


Over half of all households in the borough (56.0 per cent) do not have access to a car or van, this is the ninth highest percentage nationally and has increased by 5.6 per cent since 2001. In London, 41.6 per cent of households do not have access to a car or van.



Area Classification

Area classifications group together geographic areas according to key characteristics common to the population in that grouping. These groupings are called clusters, and are derived using 2011 Census data. Colville is defined as "Endeavouring Ethnic Mix" with a 42.1 per cent majority falling into this category (ranked 16th). The borough on average is classified as "Aspiring and Affluent" with a 72.2 per cent coverage.

Endeavouring Ethnic Mix: a higher proportion of people who belong to the Bangladeshi ethnic but a lower proportion of those in Pakistani and Indian ethnic groups. There is a higher proportion of people who were born in the old EU countries. Households are more likely to live in flats and to privately rent. Overcrowding is also more prevalent, and public transport more commonly used to get to work.

What we do...

Labour market

Economically active residents are those aged 16 to 74 that are either employed or are unemployed but actively seeking employment. 73.9 per cent of the adult population of Colville are **economically active** (5,690 residents, ranked 3rd) compared to 69.4 per cent in the borough and 71.7 per cent in London.

Overall 40.4 per cent are **full time** employees (3,112 residents, ranked 11th) and 7.5 per cent are **part time** employees (574 residents, ranked 6th). 18.0 per cent of residents are **self employed** (breakdown in figure 20a.) (1,385 residents) and is comparable to the borough and London averages of 15.4 per cent and 11.7 per cent respectively. 5.9 per cent of the adult population of Colville are economically active but **unemployed** (452 residents, ranked 4th), compared to 4.3 per cent in the borough and 5.2 per cent in London.




Economically inactive residents are residents aged 16 to 74 that are not in employment and not actively seeking a job. This group includes people who are looking after a home, the retired and some students. 26.1 per cent of the adult population of Colville are **economically inactive** (2,011 residents, ranked 16th) compared to 30.6 per cent in the borough and 28.3 per cent in London (figure 20b.).



Retired residents are the largest group of economically inactive residents in Colville, 7.9 per cent (607 residents, ranked 9th), lower than the borough (8.0) and London (8.4) averages.


Hours worked

31.1 per cent of working residents in Colville work **more than 49 hours** per week (1,611 residents, ranked 13th), which is typical of many residents of Kensington and Chelsea where the average is 35.1 per cent of residents working these long hours, far higher than the London average of 15.9 per cent.



Qualifications

49.7 per cent of the adult population of Colville ward have a **level 4 qualification (e.g. a bachelors degree)** (4,032, ranked 13th), compared to 52.7 per cent in the borough and 37.7 per cent in London. 12.6 per cent of the adult population have **no qualifications** (1,024 residents, ranked 6th) compared to 10.1 per cent in the borough, 17.6 per cent in London and 7.4 and 14.6 per cent in 2001 for the borough and London.




Unpaid care

In Colville ward, 7.7 per cent (726 residents, ranked 7th) provide **some unpaid care**. Overall in the borough 6.9 per cent provide some unpaid care.

Method of travel to work

The top three methods of travel to work in Colville are **Underground/metro/light rail/tram** (23.7 per cent, 1,826 residents, ranked 9th), **bus** (9.9 per cent, 765 residents, ranked 6th) and **on foot** (8.4 per cent, 645 residents, ranked 6th). 6.0 per cent of residents **work mainly from home** (461 residents, ranked 14th).

What we do...

Industry

The industry in which a person aged 16 to 74 works relates to their main job, and is derived from information provided on the main activity of their employer or business. These classifications have been changed which means comparisons with 2001 data cannot be made.

In Colville, the three largest industry sectors are:

1. Professional, scientific and technical activities (e.g. legal activities, accounting, marketing, advertising, veterinary activities, translation and interpretation)

16.6 per cent (863, ranked 10th) of those economically active, compared to 16.7 per cent in the borough and 10.9 per cent in London.

2. Financial and insurance activities

(e.g. banking, administration of financial markets, risk and damage evaluation, pension funding, life insurance)

15.1 per cent (781 residents ranked 14th) of economically active residents, compared to 21.5 per cent in the borough and 7.7 per cent in London.

3. Wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles and motor cycles

(e.g. wholesale of food, cars, clothing, beverages, computers, furniture, machine tools, household goods)

11.3 per cent (587 residents, ranked 6th) of economically active residents, compared to 9.6 per cent in the borough and 13.1 per cent in London.

Occupation

A person's occupation relates to their main job and is derived from either their job title or details of the activities involved in their job. This is used to assign responses to an occupation code based on the Standard Occupational Classification 2010 (SOC2010).

In Colville, the three largest occupation groups are:

1. Associate professional and technical occupations (e.g. police officers, graphic designers, laboratory technicians, town planners)

25.7 per cent (1,331 residents, ranked 9th) of those economically active, compared to 24.9 per cent in the borough and 16.3 per cent in London.

2. Professional occupations


(e.g. scientists, engineers, IT professionals, nurses, teachers)

23.5 per cent (1,217 residents, ranked 11th) of those economically active, compared to 23.4 per cent in the borough and 22.5 per cent in London.

3. Managers, directors and senior officials

(e.g. chief executives, senior officials, financial institution managers, officers in the armed forces)

19.1 per cent (989 residents, ranked 14th) of those economically active, compared to 23.3 per cent in the borough and 11.6 per cent in London.


What we do...

Workday Zones

Workday zones (WZs) are a new output geography for England and Wales which has been produced using workplace data from the 2011 Census. The population of an area changes as people move in and out of an area to work. For the **Workday Population** the **Usual Resident Population** is re-distributed to their places of work, while those not in work are recorded at their usual residence. (ONS, 2014) Figures are compared with the Census 2011 **Usual Resident Population** numbers.

Workday: Population

The **Workday Population** of Colville decreased by 635 in comparison to Census data, 8,799 compared to 9,434 residents (*see figure 26*). The **Workday Population** of Kensington and Chelsea increased by 22.2 per cent from 158,649 to 193,805 residents.



Workday: Density

Colville has a **Workday Population density** of 188.0 people per hectare (ranked 5th), compared to 201.6 in the Census. Overall Kensington and Chelsea increased to 203.7 people per hectare and 55.2 in London.

Workday: Tenure

33.3 per cent of households in Colville are **owner occupiers (including shared ownership)** (2,915 households, ranked 15th) compared to 43.2 per cent in the borough and 52.4 per cent in London.

The **private rented** sector accounts for 26.3 per cent of households (2,302 households, ranked 12th), and compares to 32.2 per cent in the borough and 24.8 per cent in London.

Social rented properties in the borough and London account for 22.5 and 21.7 per cent respectively and 39.2 per cent in Colville (3,430 properties, ranked 6th).

Workday: Health


In Colville, 51.6 per cent of the Workday Population assess their health as **very good** and 30.6 per cent selected **good health**. 11.2 per cent of the Workday Population assess their health as **bad** (rank 6th) and 1.8 per cent as **very bad** (rank 4th). In comparison to the Census, only 1.6 per cent assessed their health as **very bad**.

Workday: Qualifications

41.0 per cent of the adult population of Colville ward have a **level 4 qualification (e.g. a bachelors degree)** (3,123, ranked 13th), compared to 47.9 per cent in the borough and 38.8 per cent in London.


Workday: Religion

Figure 27 shows percentages of the religious affiliations in Colville. Overall the majority, 48.4 per cent, are **Christian** (4,260 residents, ranked 17th, a decrease of 0.1 percentage points), 10.1 per cent are **Muslim** (889 residents, ranked 8th, an increase of 0.7 percentage points) and 25.2 per cent have **no religion** (2,218 residents, ranked 2nd, an increase of 0.8 percentage points).



Workday: Ethnicity

Figure 28 shows the broad ethnic groups in Colville, Kensington and Chelsea and London, with Census comparisons. The **White group** has increased by 3.8 percentage points and the **Black/Black British group** has decreased by 5.7 percentage points in comparison to Census data.



Workday: Length of Residence in the UK 57.4 per cent of the Workday Population of Colville were born in the UK compared to the Census figure of 55.4 per cent. 24.0 of the Workday Population arrived more than 10 years ago, compared to the Census figure of 24.4 per cent (2,304 residents). 7.2 per cent arrived in the last five to 10 years and 5.9 per cent arrived in the last five years, compare to 8.4 per cent 11.8 per cent respectively.
