Designing Out Crime SPD

In accordance with Regulation 19 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Development) (England) Regulations 2004, the Council gives notice that it adopted the Supplementary Planning Document known as 'Designing Out Crime SPD' on 17 January 2008.

The SPD sets out the commitment of the Royal Borough to crime prevention, what to consider during the preparation of a scheme, and how the Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Design Adviser can help. The SPD also provides guidance for developers and planners to ensure that all development proposals incorporate the principles of designing out crime.

Any person aggrieved by the SPD may apply to the High Court for permission to apply for judicial review of the decision to adopt the SPD. Any such application for leave must be made promptly and in any event not later than 3 months after the date on which the SPD was adopted.

Accompanying the SPD are the statement setting out the consultation undertaken, the representations received and the Council's response to them (with relevant appendices); and the Sustainability Appraisal Report.
